#### 1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 5:32 p.m.

A. Pledge of Allegiance - all those present stood for the Pledge of Allegiance

## 2. Adoption of Agenda

Motion: JZ/BG to adopt the agenda as written. Motion passed 5-0.

#### 3. Approve Minutes

A. January 16, 2024, Parks & Recreation Meeting

Motion: JZ/DS to approve the minutes. Motion passed 5-0.

4. Introductions, Presentations, and Public Comment - none

#### 5. Business/Updates

A. West Carver Lions Bench Request

West Carver Lions representatives Mary Spille, Judy Maas, and Mona Bruers were present to share information on a bench donated in honor of member Lion Dar Mondor by the Green Isle Lions Club. It is a special circumstance as it is a Trex bench, which is different from the other benches in the community. They requested to place the bench in Friendship Park by the butterfly gardens. An alternate location commissioners mentioned was at the NYA Sports Complex by the Lions Shelter.

Motion: SF/DS to require all park memorials, other than pre-approved NYA park memorial programs, to be reviewed by the Parks & Recreation Commission, and approved by the City Council. Motion passed 5-0.

Motion: SF/JZ to recommend the installation of a Trex bench donated by the Green Isle Lions Club in memory of Lion Dar Mondor at the Friendship Park Butterfly Gardens with the understanding that the NYA West Carver Lions will pay for the installation of the bench. Motion passed 5-0.

#### B. Outlot A - Rezoning

Hallquist shared that the NYA Planning and Zoning Commission will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, April 2, 2024, to recommend the rezoning of Outlot A from R-1 to P-1. The recommendation will go to the City Council meeting at a future meeting for final approval.

C. Friendship Park - AARP Community Challenge Program Grant

Hallquist shared that Carver County Public Health notified staff of a grant opportunity through the AARP Community Challenge Program. The program funds up to \$50,000 for a quality-of-life project that benefits citizens aged 50+. Due to the grant's timing (due on Wed, March 6, 2024), PSD Mark Streich recommended the grant application be submitted for a trail project at Friendship Park. The entire trail would be milled and overlayed, an extension of the trail would reach the tennis/pickleball courts according to ADA standards, and three benches would be added to the trail near the east side of the trail by the courts. The City will be notified in mid-May of the selection status. The City Council approved a Resolution at their February 26, 2024, Council meeting in support of the application. An estimate of the project was \$51,000 for the trail and \$3,600 for benches.

#### D. Arbor Day Event

Commissioners agreed that the Arbor Day event be at Prairie Dawn Park on Thursday, May 30<sup>th</sup> starting at 9am. There will be six trees planted along with some kids activities. Staff will reach out to the girls and boy scouts to partner. Six additional trees will be planted at Friendship Park to start new growth there.

# E. Old Town Update

Hallquist reported on major progress happening at the New Old Town. Donations are still being accepted. The project is still on schedule to finish no later than June 30, 2024. At some point this spring, Commissioners will plan a Ribbon Cutting/Grand Opening for this summer.

#### F. West Carver Community Pool

City Public Service staff will be working on fixing the bulged fencing at the pool this week. They will also be prepping for a simplified landscaping plan for around the entire pool. Landscaping will include arborvitae, Karl Forster grasses, and black-eyed Susan plants – all of which do not require a high level of maintenance or shed leaves that cause blockage in the pool drains. Mayer Lumber will be delivering the supply shed soon. The pool house project planning will also be starting soon. More details to come. Swimming lesson information will be available around May 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### G. Carver Co Community Foundation Grant

Hallquist recommended the City apply for the Carver Co Community Foundation Grant for a parks project. The CFCC focuses on organizations providing "civic" service and other areas that make a sustainable positive impact in the community with community partners.

Motion: SF/BG the recommendation to apply for the Carver Co Community Foundation Grant in the amount of \$5,000 with funding to go toward the New Old Town Project. Motion passed 5-0.

Representatives of the Norwood Baseball Board, Charlie Storms and Kelly Lueck, met with city staff to discuss 2024 projects at Zellmann Field in the NYA Sports Complex. Storms and Lueck will be present at the Parks & Rec meeting to answer any questions of the following:

#### **Scoreboard Project**

- The baseball team plans to replace the existing scoreboard at the NYA Sports Complex Zellmann Field with a digital LED scoreboard from Daktronics. The existing scoreboard is 30 years old. Due to the age of the board, replacement parts are not in existence.
- The location of the scoreboard will be installed in the center field rather than the existing right field scoreboard, which is hard to view by spectators – specifically spectators near the concession stand bleachers.
- The cost of the new scoreboard is approximately \$60,000 which includes installation.
- To date, the baseball team has received approximately \$45,000 in donations/sponsorships in return for an advertisement beneath the new scoreboard. The amount of the donation is acknowledged by the size of the advertisement.
- The timeline goal for replacement is August 2024 with the new scoreboard installed before the old one comes down.
- Norwood Baseball will pull the appropriate building permits (footings, electrical, etc.) to install the new board and keep in contact with PSD Mark Streich during the duration of the project.
- City staff will be helping with the takedown of the old board. The baseball team will dispose of the old board.

#### Batter's Eye Screening

- The baseball team will replace the canvas batter's eye screen with a steel trellis that will be the backbones for climbing ivy plants.
- Henning Excavating will fix the existing posts and adhere to the new trellis.
- The Delano Ball Club is providing clippings of the ivy for 60 starter plants which will be planted by the Norwood baseball team sometime in mid-June. They, too, will maintain and water the plants.

#### Tree Replacement

- The four evergreen trees in centerfield behind the batter's eye screen have been removed.
- City staff will grind out the stumps.
- The baseball team has intentions of planting approximately a dozen evergreen trees (that grow to about 15 ft tall) along the outfield fence. However, the number is yet to be determined until the batter's eye screen is in place.
- City staff will water the new trees.

#### **Concession Stand Additions**

• The baseball team will add a new menu board and an over-the-counter sign as a second means of acknowledgment for the new scoreboard sponsors.

#### 5B. West Carver Lions Bench Request

The City Council approved the bench donation and location request from the West Carver Lions. Installation will happen this spring.

#### 5C. Outlot A - Rezoning

The final step of rezoning of Outlot A will be the approval at the April 22<sup>nd</sup> City Council Meeting. Staff is researching the DNR grant for the next steps of completing Outlot A.

#### 5D. Friendship Park - AARP Community Challenge Program Grant

Staff submitted the grant application on March 6<sup>th</sup> with the request for \$50,000 to the walking trail at Friendship Park. The entire trail would be milled and overlayed, an extension of the trail would reach the tennis/pickleball courts according to ADA standards, and three benches would be added to the trail near the east side by the courts. The City will be notified in mid-May of the selection status.

#### 5E. Arbor Day Event - Prairie Dawn Park, May 30th 9am

Staff reached out to Boy Scout and Girl Scout leaders to gauge interest in partnering for the event.

- Partners for the event (i.e. Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, etc.)

#### 5F. Old Town Update


