2. Approve Agenda

2.1 Review Snow Removal Procedures
Snow emergency is declared when there is two inches or blowing of snow. Residents cannot park on the street when there is a snow emergency. Vehicles that are parked on the street during a snow emergency will be ticketed or towed. It depends on the timing of the snow start and end time for when the plows go out.

2.2 Miscellaneous Updates

- Spring Clean Up Day Helget contacted both refuse haulers (Waste Management and Randy's). Waste Management is \$50 per ton but will not do curbside pick up. Randy's would do curbside, however, the cost would be \$13,000 for 3 hours and anything over that would be \$300 an hour. Neither company are available in May when the City was hoping to do the event.
- 793 Tacoma Nuisance Carver County charged a misdemeanor for the vehicles. The City could charge a fee for the junk nuisance issue. There is also a building in the backyard that the City is going to take a look at.
- Social Media Policy Hayes presented the Social Media Policy from the League of MN Cities. She included a few bulletpoints that she found on other city websites that were more specific than what the League had for their policy Example: League's policy states "discrimination" and a social media policy that was found on a different MN City states "Content that promotes, fosters, or perpetuates discrimination on the basis of race, creed, color, age, religion, gender, marital status, status in regards to public assistance, national origin, physical or mental disability, or sexual orientation". The policy will be brought back to the council at the next meeting.
- Marco Will be installing equipment the end of the week. March 5 they will meet with Helget to come up with a plan. Will start sometime between March 18 - 29.
- EDC Consultant Helget is meeting with a company called CEDA. They would charge on an hourly basis, approximately \$62 an hour. The consultant would probably office in City Hall a portion of her hours.
- Auto Repair in Downtowns Planning Commission would like to meet with Council to discuss this issue to make sure they are understanding what the Council wants.

SUBJECT: Joint Work Session with Planning Commission

The City Council at its February 11th meeting approved scheduling a Joint Work Session with the Planning Commission for the purpose of discussing the establishment of "auto repair uses" in certain zoning districts. One of the Planning Commission's 2019 goals is to consider the merits of providing for auto repair uses in commercial and industrial zoning districts.

Currently the City's Zoning Code provides for the following:

- 1. Automobile "service stations" are allowed with a CUP in the C-2, General Commercial District.
- 2. Automobile "repair, major" is allowed as a permitted use in the B-I, Business Industrial District.
- 3. Auto repair as an accessory use is allowed in the C-3, Downtown District.
- Auto repair (either major or minor) is not an allowable use, either principal or conditional, in the C-3, RC-1, or I-1 Districts.
- Central Auto and Pro Auto are currently operating in the C-3 and RC-1 Districts respectively as non-conforming uses.
- 6. Curfman Trucking has requested consideration of allowing semi-truck repair in the I-1 District.

The following are the current definitions of major and minor auto repair and automobile service stations:

Automobile repair, major. General repair, rebuilding or reconditioning of engines, motor vehicles or trailers, including body work, frame work and major painting service.

Automobile repair, minor. Incidental repairs, replacement of parts and motor service to automobiles, but not including any operation specified under Automobile repair, major.

Automobile service station. Any building or premises used for the dispensing or sale of automobile fuels, lubricating oil or grease, tires, batteries or minor automobile accessories. Services offered may include the installation of tires, batteries or minor accessories; minor automobile repairs; and greasing or washing of individual automobiles. When sales, services and repairs as detailed here are offered to the public, the premises will be classified as a public garage. Automobile service stations shall not include the sale or storage of vehicles; shall not include premises offering major automobile repairs, automobile wrecking or detached car washes.

Enclosed from the Planning Commission's February 5, 2019 meeting is a copy of the staff memo on auto repair uses and a draft ordinance amendment.

BACKGROUND

The Planning Commission has initiated review of zoning standards pertaining to auto repair uses in various districts. At the January meeting the PC reached consensus to review draft language providing for:

- 1. Amend definitions of minor & major auto repair.
- 2. Allow minor auto repair in the RC-1 District as a conditional use.
- 3. Allow minor auto repair in the C-3 Downtown Districts as a conditional use.
- Allow minor and major auto repair in the I-1 Light Industrial District as permitted uses but with the understanding a CUP is needed for any outdoor storage.
- Allow repair of non-passenger automobiles such as semi-trucks/trailers, heavy equipment, agricultural equipment, boats, and marine equipment as conditional use in I-1 District.

Attached please find draft code amendment language for review.

Also attached are minutes from meetings (PC & CC) in 2009 where the RC-1 District was discussed.

CITY OF NORWOOD YOUNG AMERICA ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1200.04, DEFINITIONS, CHAPTER 1230.08, SUBD. 4 CONDITIONAL USES IN THE RC-1 RESIDENCE NEIGHBORHOOD COMMERCIAL DISTRICT, CHAPTER 1230.10, SUBD. 4 CONDITIONAL USES IN THE C-3 DOWNTOWN DISTRICTS, CHAPTER 1230.12, SUBD. 2(G) OF THE I-1 LIGHT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT, AND CHAPTER 1230.12, SUBD. 4(D) CONDITIONAL USES IN THE I-1 LIGHT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICTS TO PROVIDE FOR MINOR AND MAJOR AUTO REPAIR.

- I. THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORWOOD YOUNG AMERICA, MINNESOTA HEREBY ORDAINS:
- II. SECTION 1200.04 OF THE NORWOOD YOUNG AMERICA CITY CODE IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS.

Automobile repair, major. Auto-body repair of passenger automobiles General repair, rebuilding or reconditioning of engines, motor vehicles or trailers, including body work, frame work and major painting service.

Automobile repair, minor. Mechanical repair of passenger automobiles such as incidental repairs, replacement of parts and motor service to automobiles, but not including any operation specified under Automobile repair, major.

III. SECTION 1230.08, SUBD. (4) OF THE NORWOOD YOUNG AMERICA CITY CODE IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS.

Subd. 4 Conditional Uses. The following uses are permitted, subject to the provisions of Section 1210.06:

Principal Uses:

- A. Churches, schools and similar public uses
- B. Condominiums
- C. Contractor Operations (Amended by Ord. 216; 8-24-2009)
- D. Licensed Daycare Facilities, other than those permitted in Subd. 2.E. above
- E. Converted residential dwellings for lodging services, such as hotels, motels and bed and breakfasts.
- F. Multifamily, up to 4-units per dwelling

G. Custom or Limited Manufacturing, Assembly, or Treatment of Articles or Merchandise from Previously Prepared Materials, such as cloth, fiber, leather, metal, paper, plastic, stone, wax, wood, and wool. (Amended by Ord. 303, 5-30-2018)

H. Minor Auto Repair provided:

- Fencing and screening. When abutting a property used for residential purposes a landscaped buffer sufficient to screen the use from the adjacent residence at all times of the year shall be provided. When abutting a commercial property a fence is required.
- No vehicles shall be parked on the premises other than those utilized by employees, used by the business, or awaiting service. No vehicle shall be parked or be waiting service longer than fifteen (15) days. Vehicles shall display current licenses.
- iii. Junk yards and/or auto salvage is prohibited.
- Exterior storage besides other than vehicles shall be limited to service equipment and incidental, seasonal, and occasional items offered for sale.
- v. The storage of tires, batteries and other such items for sale outside the building is allowed only during hours of business operation.
- vi. Business activities not listed in the definition of auto repair, major or minor may be allowed if a conditional use permit is obtained specifically for such business. Such activities include but are not limited to the following: 1) automatic car and truck wash, 2) rental of vehicles, equipment or trailers, and 3) general retail sales.

IV. SECTION 1230.10, SUBD. 4 OF THE NORWOOD YOUNG AMERICA CITY CODE IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS.

Subd. 4 Conditional Uses. The following uses are permitted, subject to the provisions of Section 1210.06:

Principal Uses:

- A. Contractor Operations (Amended by Ord. 216; 8-24-2009)
- B. Lodging Services, such as hotels, motels and bed and breakfasts.
- C. Entertainment Services, such as motion picture theaters and bowling alleys
- D. Licensed Daycare Facilities
- E. Custom or limited manufacturing, assembly, or treatment of articles or merchandise from previously prepared materials, such as cloth, fiber, leather, metal, paper, plastic, stone, wax, wood, and wool (Amended by Ord. 261, 5-11-2015)
- F. Auto Dealership Sales, Storage, and Display with or without ancillary minor auto repair and service, provided:
 - i. Sales, display, and storage are limited to new and used passenger automobiles.
 - ii. A valid dealership license is maintained.
 - Office space devoted to perform transactions in conjunction with the business is provided on site.
 - iv. Service and repair, if provided, are clearly secondary and subordinate to the use of the property for auto dealer sales, display, and storage:
 - v. Auto service and repair, if provided, shall be conducted indoors and all automobiles undergoing service or repair shall be stored off-street.
 - vi. Auto repair shall not include vehicle painting or auto body work. (Amended by Ord 274, 6-27-16)
- H. Veterinary clinic, animal care, animal shelter, pet daycare, pet training, or animal hospital.
- I. Minor Auto Repair, provided:

- Fencing and screening. When abutting a property used for residential purposes a landscaped buffer sufficient to screen the use from the adjacent residence at all times of the year shall be provided. When abutting a commercial property a fence is required.
- ii. No vehicles shall be parked on the premises other than those utilized by employees, used by the business, or awaiting service. No vehicle shall be parked or be waiting service longer than fifteen (15) days. Vehicles shall display current licenses.
- iii. Junk yards and/or auto salvage is prohibited.
- Exterior storage other than vehicles shall be limited to service equipment and incidental, seasonal, and occasional items offered for sale.
- v. The storage of tires, batteries and other such items for sale outside the building is allowed only during hours of business operation.
- vi. Business activities not listed in the definition of auto repair, major or minor may be allowed if a conditional use permit is obtained specifically for such business. Such activities include but are not limited to the following: 1) automatic car and truck wash, 2) rental of vehicles, equipment or trailers, and 3) general retail sales.

V. SECTION 1230.12, SUBD. 2 OF THE NORWOOD YOUNG AMERICA CITY CODE IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS.

Permitted Uses. The following uses are permitted in the Light Industrial District:

- A. Contractor Operations;
- B. Laboratories:
- C. Light Industry;
- D. Utilities (public sewer, water);
- E. Warehousing:
- F. Wholesale Trade and Showrooms
- G. Minor Auto Repair, subject to standards contained in Section 1230.12, Subd. 4 pertaining to accessory outdoor storage, as may be amended.
- H. Major Auto Repair, subject to standards contained in Section 1230.12, Subd. 4 pertaining to accessory outdoor storage, as may be amended.

VI. SECTION 1230.12, SUBD. 4 OF THE NORWOOD YOUNG AMERICA CITY CODE IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS.

Subd. 4 Conditional Uses. The following uses are permitted, subject to the provisions of Section 1210.06:

Principal Uses:

- A. Antennas, satellite dishes, communication and radio towers:
- B. Vocational and Technical Schools:
- C. Adult Uses
- D. Non-Passenger Auto Repair such as semi-truck repair, large equipment repair, agricultural equipment repair, boat repair, and marine equipment repair, provided:

- Fencing and screening. When abutting a property used for residential purposes a landscaped buffer sufficient to screen the use from the adjacent residence at all times of the year shall be provided. When abutting a commercial property a fence is required.
- ii. No vehicle or equipment shall be parked on the premises other than those utilized by employees, used by the business, or awaiting service. No vehicle or equipment shall be parked or be waiting service longer than fifteen (15) days. Vehicles and equipment, if required to be licensed, shall display current licenses.
- iii. Junk yards and/or auto salvage is prohibited.
- Exterior storage other than vehicles and equipment being repaired shall be limited to service equipment and incidental, seasonal, and occasional items offered for sale.
- v. The storage of tires, batteries and other such items for sale outside the building is allowed only during hours of business operation.
- vi. Business activities such as automatic car and truck wash, rental of vehicles, equipment or trailers, and general retail sales may be allowed.

Accessory Uses:

- C. A. Freight and yard equipment;
- D. B. Outdoor Auto, Truck, Recreational Vehicle and Equipment Sales and Display;
- E. C. Outdoor Storage;
- F. D. Barbed-wire Fencing



MnDOT has reviewed the draft 2040 update of the Norwood Comprehensive Plan submitted 2/7/19 and offers the following comments:

Traffic

The traffic volumes shown on page 68 in Table 19 for US 212 and MN 5 are from 2014 and 2015. Traffic volume information for these highways is also available for the years 2016 and 2017 via this link: http://mndotgis.dot.state.mn.us/tfa/Map. This more recent traffic volume data could be incorporated into Table 19 to provide a more current picture of traffic in the 2015-2016 timeframe.

Regarding the Future Roadway Concept on Figure 20 presented on page 79: It appears that the section of MN 5/25 where both highways run concurrently is shown as being realigned to the west as a new A Minor Arterial connection (dark blue dashed line). MnDOT anticipates that with the future roundabout at the intersection of MN 5 and CSAH 33, the north/south portion of MN 5/25 north of US 212 will remain as an A-Minor Arterial, as shown on Figure 14. However, there are no future MnDOT projects planned to create such a new alignment for MN 5/25. MnDOT suggests that the future roadway concept for this segment of MN 5/25 could be shown in Figure 20 as a green dashed line and labeled as a future major collector. This would also apply to the light blue dashed line that continues south at Railroad Street.

Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities

MnDOT suggests that the plan clearly identify the location of the planned pedestrian underpass under US 212. Currently, the plan says the underpass will be "near Morse Street." MnDOT recommends that the description of the underpass location reflects the currently proposed location, which is between Reform and Morse Streets.


