The Planning Commission at its August 6 meeting took public input on establishing possible aesthetic standards for buildings located in the C-3, Downtown Districts. Several citizens were present and shared their concerns. Those concerns included:

- Some businesses shade their windows to keep the sun from beating in to save on cooling costs and possible carpet fading
- Windows are covered to protect personal property from viewing
- There should be a separation of criteria for business buildings and residential homes/buildings located in the C-3 zone
- If viewing in the buildings is desired, how far in?
- Some property owners prefer tinted windows to lesson sun glare and cooling costs

The consensus of the citizens that spoke at the Planning Commission meeting was the proposed criteria is not a good idea.
