4.1 Harbor / Haven

The Haven is full with 3 reserved.

4.2 Peace Villa

Fee schedule updates as of June 1, 2020. A one-bedroom apartment has a waiting time of 18 months, two bedroom for a couple is 12-15 months, and not possible for a single person to rent a two bedroom.

4.3 Oak Grove

In 2019 there were 11 move outs. Currently there are 9 couples with a total of 59 residents with 33 on a waiting list.

Bus trips are going well and Peggy is doing a great job.

6.1 Senior Center

Current games are Sheephead, 500 and Bingo. There were 17 participants on 02/19/2020. Financially the center is doing well. Participants are not eating as many snacks.

7. Updates from Community

7.1 Carver County Public Health

There will be a joint senior advisory meeting on April 14, 2020 at the Waconia City Hall with a guest speaker funded by SHIP. There is an Emergency Preparedness Event on June 17, 2020 at the Chaska High School. This will be a simulation of an anthrax attack. LaVonne will talk with the West Carver Lions about volunteering as the event needs 50 players. "Let's Talk Food" is co-sponsored by the City and CCPH to have a community engagement session about the grocery store situation in NYA. Event scheduled for Thursday, April 2nd at 6:00pm at the Pavilion. RSVPs are requested.

7.2 NYA City Council

The City Council approved a letter of support for Metro Mobility in their efforts of bus driver/volunteer legislation. DS gave an update on the Highway 212 project.

7.3 Carver County Sheriff's Department
Deputy Arnst explained the Emergency Decal Program. These decals will alert first responders to have a heads up with a potential medical condition. CCPH asked about partnering this program with their home visits.
