In the past two weeks, I've had three opportunities to share with strangers the amazing blessings that come with living in Norwood Young America. It is my favorite part of the job as Mayor! As I gathered and organized my thoughts, I was reminded of how truly lucky we are --- we have amazing opportunities at our fingertips and yet we have continued to maintain that friendly, small-town feel. We have amazing opportunities to enjoy the outdoors: With the opening of the new Underpass and additional trails, we now have even more ways to take advantage of the healthy benefits of walking, running or biking. Despite the recent frigid temperatures, many people are outside enjoying the expanded trail system, skating at the community ice rink or heading 3 miles north to snowshoe and cross country ski at Baylor Park. For those of you who enjoy warmer temperatures --- we are only three months away from re-opening the Community Pool!

We value the fine arts: In the past year, we have added some beautiful new artwork to the outdoor canvas of our community. We are so fortunate to have one of the three Freedom Rocks in Minnesota at Veterans Park on the east side of town. In addition, the beautiful mural on the SLS Building on the south side of town reminds us that "all tracks lead home." Are you wondering what's ahead? Watch for more information on the Chamber of Commerce Springfest Artisan Fair (May), a cooperative agreement with Central Schools to display high school artwork in the underpass (May), a new mural on the north side of town (June/July) and Stiftungsfest 2021 (August).



In addition, several other new businesses are in the process of finalizing purchase agreements on vacant buildings throughout our community. COVID Vaccine Updates

How are vaccines allocated in Minnesota? Each week, the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) determines the allocations of vaccine dosages for local public health agencies, including Carver County Public Health. CCPH continuously monitors and adjusts the vaccination plans in bringing additional priority groups into clinics as vaccine doses and appointments become available. Priority groups for vaccinations are based on guidance from MDH. Carver County Public Health's ability to plan and post clinics in advance is based on the number of vaccines they receive from the state. They will continue to post clinic information in a timely manner as much as possible. CCPH's goal is to ensure that all Carver County residents who want the vaccine can receive it.

Veterans Transportation Program now available! Carver County Veterans Services is transporting veterans to and from their VA Medical Center and VA Clinic appointments. While the program is similar to pre-COVID-19 operations, they have adjusted several aspects to ensure safety during the pandemic:

- Veteran Services staff will conduct health screenings to ensure safety for everyone.
- Rides are limited to one veteran per vehicle, with two vehicles operating per day. If allowed by a medical
- provider, veterans may request a guest to accompany them.
- Transportation to the Mpls VA Medical Center are: Monday—Thursdays (excluding holidays). On Wednesdays, veterans can make appointments for transportation to and from the Shakopee VA Clinic. Please schedule appointments between 8:00am—2:30pm if utilizing transportation services.

2021 Street Projects

At a recent Council meeting, two summer street projects were approved for 2021! Both projects are on the north side of town and have been talked about for quite some time. The combined cost of the projects is approximately \$2.7 million, but there will be no additional tax impact on our residents! The exception will be citizens living or owning property along the project path who will pay a special assessment per city policy. You have been extremely patient for the past five years as new street projects were put on hold while the Council waited for a reduction in current debt obligations. That wait has been rewarded ... since our debt obligations have been reduced, we are again able to add new street construction projects to our agenda!

Oak Lane: In 2013, the city annexed the Oak Lane properties into the city. At that time, an agreement was reached with the township stating that the Oak Lane properties would connect to the city sewer and water systems within 10 years (January 1, 2023). In order for this to occur the city must first provide sewer and water mains for these homes to connect to. An additional section of the agreement allowed property owners two years to connect once service was made available. These deadlines require completion of this project in the summer of 2021. Total cost of the project (including paving the road and utility work) is estimated at approximately \$900,000.

Second Avenue Lift Station and Street Reconstruction: The Second Avenue Lift Station is responsible for handling the wastewater of the majority of the northern part of our community. The Second Avenue Lift Station is at the end of its design life and needs to be replaced. This project is a high priority for the city, which involves replacing the old lift station to an upgraded one in the same location. The cost of replacement is approximately \$800,000. By doing the lift station work in conjunction with at least a portion of the Second Avenue Street project, the City would be able to minimize impacts and reconstruction costs. The Council approved moving forward with this project, to include reconstructing Second Avenue from the "five way stop" to the north entrance of Devonshire Drive, for this summer. The total cost of the project is \$1.8 million. The remainder of the Second Avenue reconstruction will be addressed in the near future.

All trees upon private property shall be the responsibility of the property owner.
