# Message From Mayor Lagergren

Last month I shared with you how much I love the idea that "April showers bring May flowers". Well, according to the weather station in Chanhassen, we had approximately 5 inches of rainfall in April. (Fun fact ... that would have been almost 5 feet of snow!) If April was the month of showers, then this May will be full of amazing blooms! It is my pleasure to share what else, besides flowers, will be blooming around our community this spring:

 $B_{ig}$  projects: You will soon be seeing some big street reconstruction projects happening around town. Project #1 will occur on Oak Lane, which was annexed from Young America Township in 2013. At that time, a plan for adding the residents along this street to city water and sewer was developed. This summer, the final hookups to residents will become available. Project #2 will cover the first phase of the Second Avenue Reconstruction and Lift Station Replacement. This project will cover reconstruction from the five way stop to the north exit/entrance of Devonshire Drive.

Lots of new lighting: New lighting along the Hwy 212 trail on either side of the Underpass will soon be completed. The additional lighting will follow the trail along the south side of Highway 212 as well as the north trail which travels through school property. The lighting will be beautiful and a great addition to Kehrer Park and our new trails!

Outstanding new displays of artwork: The plan to place artwork from Central High School students along the underpass walls has been detoured. Final approval from MnDOT is still pending, so the art projects completed by students will be displayed along the fencing around the West Carver Community Pool at Legion Park. Look for these amazing teenage interpretations on the ideas of kindness, community and current events.!

Opening of the pool: At the May 10th Council meeting, lifeguards and WSIs (lesson instructors) were approved for this summer. As a Council, we are excited about the recent change in guidelines by the Governor ... new protocols have lifted the attendance limits at the pool this summer. We are also allowed to again offer lessons for our youngest citizens. We are so excited to be able to offer unrestricted access to the only outdoor pool in Carver County!

Memorial Day: Celebrating Memorial Day has been a longstanding tradition in my family. My father, a Korean War veteran, was a dedicated member of both the local VFW and American Legion posts, so I remember walking with the veterans on Memorial Day when I was young. I remember playing in the band at the annual Memorial Day Program as a high school student. I remember bringing my sons to the Memorial Day Program watching them stand with the Boy Scouts and later playing in the Band. I am so pleased that we will again be able to celebrate Memorial Day as a community and take an opportunity to honor the many veterans from our community!

There are so many exciting things blooming throughout our community and it is my pleasure to share some of the highlights with you each month! We are continuing to work together to prepare for a fabulous summer ... another chance to share that Norwood Young America is more than a place, it's our home! And what a beautiful home it is! 

# Making some home improvements? Not sure if you need a permit?

Building permits are required for residential re-roofing, re-siding, same size window replacements, furnace/AC replacement, and signs that do not require footing installation. The building permit fee for these types of jobs is \$61.00 and can be issued the same day over the counter. For a water heater or softener, the fee is \$15.00. However, please check with the City to determine if any additional information will be required.

**Building permits** are required for most residential and commercial improvements. These permits require plan review by the Building Official and the fee is based on the value of the materials and labor for the project. Depending on the complexity of the plan review, building permits generally take 7-10 days for processing.

A building permit is required for the following projects, but is not limited to:

Any type of commercial work

New construction

Home alterations

Additions

Unattached garage

Finish basement

Mechanical and Plumbing

**Porches** 

Garages

**Decks** 

Storage sheds over 200 square feet

Masonry fireplace

Chimneys

Signs that require footings

Demolition

Moved-In Structures

Installing an in-ground swimming pool





The City utilizes the same Building Permit application for all of the above type projects.

The City utilizes Metro West Inspection Services for its building inspection services (763)479-1720

#### **Administrative Permits**

For some improvements a building permit is not required but an Administrative Permit may. The purpose of an Administrative Permit is to ensure the improvement complies with the City's Zoning Code/Ordinance. An Administrative Permit is required for fences, sheds under 200 square feet, concrete, or asphalt surfaces such as for patios or a parking stall off the side of the garage. There is no fee for an Administrative Permit but is required to be obtained prior to commencing any work. A separate application is utilized for Administrative Permits.





# **Friendly Reminders**

#### Golf Cart/ATV Permit

Chapter 7 of the NYA City Code allows for a person to drive a Golf Cart or Class 2 ATV on City streets as long as a City permit is obtained and the operator has a valid driver's license. There is an annual permit fee of \$10.00 for these recreational vehicles. Applications can be filled out right at City Hall or found on the City website at www.cityofnya.com.

#### Lawn Maintenance

Yard grass must be maintained at no longer than 6" high. Please ensure your grass clippings do not blow onto the street. The clippings cause the storm sewer to clog, which may cause flooding in your home or your neighbor's home.

#### What can I burn? When can I burn?

What is considered a Recreational Fire? Recreational Fire" shall mean a fire set with approved starter fuel, that is no larger than three feet in diameter by two feet in height, using dry, clean wood; producing little detectable smoke, odor or soot beyond the property line; for recreational, ceremonial, food preparation or social purposes; extinguished completely before quitting the occasion; and respecting weather conditions, neighbors, burning bans, and air quality so that nuisance, health or safety hazards shall not be created. No open burning is allowed except recreational fires within City limits. Mobile cooking devices such as manufactured hibachis, charcoal grills, wood smokers and propane or natural gas devices shall not be defined as recreational fires.

How can I start a fire? "Starter Fuels" can be used to start a fire: dry, untreated, unpainted kindling, branches, or cardboard, or charcoal fire starter. Paraffin candles and alcohols shall be permitted as starter fuels and as aids to ignition only.

What can I burn? NOT GARBAGE OR LEAVES! You CAN burn wood: clean fuel only such as twigs, branches, limbs, "presto logs," charcoal, cordwood or untreated dimensional lumber. "Wood" shall not include wood that is green, with leaves or needles, rotten, wet, oil soaked, or treated with paint, glue or preservatives, nor, leaves and needles.



#### Minimum Requirements for Recreational Fires:

- Recreational fires must be at least 25 feet from all buildings, structures, and combustible materials.
   Combustible materials are things such as wood, paper, and plastics.
- Conditions which could cause a fire to spread within 25 feet of a structure shall be eliminated prior to ignition.
- Recreational fires must be constantly attended until the fire burns out completely or is extinguished.
- A minimum of one portable fire extinguisher complying with Minnesota State Fire Code or other approved on-site fire extinguishing equipment, such as dirt, sand, or garden hose shall be readily available at all times until the fire is extinguished.
- Recreational fires must be immediately extinguished if they pose a fire safety risk, if they are not in
- compliance with the above, or when directed to do so by a law enforcement officer, firefighter, fire warden, or DNR officer.

When can I burn? No recreational fire or open burn shall be permitted when the city, county, DNR, or local designated authority has officially declared a burning ban due to potential hazardous fire conditions or when the MPCA has declared an Air Quality Alert. Information regarding burning bans shall be obtained from the local fire department, DNR, or the MPCA before starting a permitted fire. Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine and/or imprisonment.
