




A Message From Mayor Lagergren

Today with 24-7 access to news feeds, it is easy to be distracted by worry and fear. During this holiday season, it feels appropriate to honor the message to stay present and be "in the moment" with family and friends.

Yesterday is history: This past year we have started to move forward through Year 2 of the pandemic. In our community, we com-

pleted the first road construction in five years with work on Oak Lane and Second Avenue. We welcomed one new single family home and seven townhomes. We also became the home to many new businesses and planned expansions:

Tomorrow is a mystery: Our future looks bright with many projects in the works for 2022! City staff will continue to research the site of a new Industrial Park. Did you know that a new business has already met with staff to be the first manufacturer in our new park? We are so excited

to share that several developers have contacted city staff to open new housing developments for single family, townhomes and/or twin homes. Finally, Phase 2 of Second Avenue is planned and ready to move forward (without adding to the tax burden of our citizens).

Truth in Taxation Public Hearing

On Monday, December 13th, the City Council will be having their yearly Truth in Taxation Hearing. The purpose of this hearing is to provide information to taxpayers about the potential impact of the proposed tax levy on individual properties and homeowners.

For 2022, the City Council set a preliminary levy at 3.5%. Most taxpayers within city limits should see a minimal impact on the city portion of their Proposed 2022 Property Tax Statement. The exception would be property owners who saw a significant increase in their property value, perhaps due to a recent renovation project. If you have any questions about the process or your personal tax statement, please attend the Public Hearing on Monday, December 16th at 6 PM at City Hall.

COVID-19 Testing Continues at Lake Waconia Event Center

Carver County Public Health continues to offer free, COVID-19 saliva (PCR) tests at the Lake Waconia Event Center, with no appointments required. Testing is available Wednesdays from 12-4 pm and Friday from 10 am-2 pm.

Vaccination & Booster Opportunities

There are approximately 1,100 vaccine providers in pharmacies, health-care providers and smaller state-run sites across the state of Minnesota. Any resident, age 5 years and older, can receive a COVID-19 vaccine.

Federal health officials have now authorized Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 booster shots. According to the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) guidance, Minnesotans age 18 and older who got the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine should get a booster shot at least six months after their initial series. All Minnesotans age 18 and older who got the Johnson & Johnson vaccine should get a booster shot at least two months after their initial vaccine.

Officials also authorized 'mixing and matching' COVID-19 vaccine boosters, meaning anybody who is eligible to get a booster shot can get any of the three currently authorized or approved vaccines (Pfizer, Moderna, Johnson & Johnson) – regardless of what product they received for their primary series. Minnesotans can direct questions about mixing and matching doses to their health care provider. 'Tis That Time of Year... for Scams

The holiday's are supposed to be the time of the year for cherishing time with family and celebrating with friends. Unfortunately, it is also the time of year for bad people to take advantage of good people. Please let these simple tips serve as friendly reminders when approached with situations that "just don't seem right."

- The IRS will NEVER call you for personal information. Do not give out any personal information about your address, birthday, social security number, banking accounts, or credit card details to anyone!
- If you receive a phone call from someone saying "Your grandchild is in jail and needs help" it is NOT true. Make sure to never say your grandchild's name during this conversion—the scammer will use that personal information to further the conversation! Never give them bank account information or credit card numbers. Hang up immediately and call your grandchild or family member directly to tell them about the phone call you received.
- If you are taking a vacation over the winter or are lucky enough to be a "snowbird," try to remember to have your mail forwarded or halted until you get back, arrange for someone to shovel your driveway/walkway to make it look like someone is home, and put timers on lights to insinuate you are home. You are also welcome to call the Carver County Non-Emergency line at 952-361-1231 to request extra patrol presence in your neighborhood while you are gone.

Stray Dogs and Cats Addressed by City Council

Have you noticed a stray or lost animal in your neighborhood? Based on a recent decision by the City Council, the Carver County CSO (Community Service Officer) can now address this issue. At that meeting, the Council approved 4 Paws Animal Control of Savage as their official Impound Center for stray animals.

The process for dealing with stray animals within city limits includes the following steps:

- Citizens should immediately call the non-emergency line of the Sheriff's Department at (952)361-1231 and report the location of the stray animal.
- The Carver County CSO will respond to the location and contact 4 Paws Animal Control if an animal is taken into custody at that location.
- 4 Paws Animal Control will attempt to contact the owner if the animal is chipped. If not chipped, they will hold the animal for 5 to 7 days. During that time, 4 Paws will post information on the impounded animal at https://www.facebook.com/FriendsOf4PawsAnimalControl/.
- After 7 days, 4 Paws will work with a Rescue Agency to have the animal made available for adoption.

Please note: The City of Norwood Young America will be charged for each animal impounded. The City reserves the right to invoice the pet owner for all costs associated with the impound process.

Ticket & Towing

This winter the City will be stepping up its ticketing and towing of vehicles that are in violation of parking on city streets during a snow event which is the accumulation of two (2) or more inches of falling or blowing snow. Vehicles parked on a city street during a snow event will be ticketed, and if not moved within four (4) hours, and/or towed. All fines for tickets are to be paid wot the Carver County Court Administrator's Office. Vehicles that are towed will be towed to Smith Oil in Norwood Young America. Prior to getting their vehicle back, the vehicle owner will be required to pay all towing fees, show proof of vehicle ownership, proof of vehicle insurance, and a valid driver's license. The vehicle will also have to have up-to-date license plates.

Designated Parking Areas

New for this snow season are designated parking areas for residents who do not have off-street parking available. Parking in the designated parking areas will be enforced from 2am-6am. The parking restrictions follow our city street parking ordinance as stated above (Ticket & Towing). Look for designated parking signs in both the Elm Street Municipal Parking Lot and Old City Hall parking lot (1st Ave SE & 1st Street NE).
