Recognizing Veterans Day by Honoring the Flag

On June 22, 1942, Congress passed a joint resolution, later amended on December 22, 1942, that encompassed what has come to be known as the U.S. Flag Code. Perhaps the most important guideline involves how citizens should behave around the Stars and Stripes: The flag of the United States is the emblem of our identity as a sovereign nation, which the United States of America has been for more than 200 years.



Therefore, members of the armed services and veterans are asked to stand at attention and salute when their flag is passing in a parade or being hoisted or lowered; civilians should stand, remove their hats and place their right hand over their heart. An additional note: this behavior is also appropriate and required during the playing and/or singing of the National Anthem. Local Election Results

The Central Public School Board canvassed the election results for the Central Public School Building Bond Referendum on Thursday, November 4, 2021.

- ⇒ Question 1: Passed—Yes 1,043; No 337 *Addresses safety, security and American's with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessibility; modernizes learning spaces, and repairs aging buildings and systems.
- Question 2: Passed—Yes 994; No 432 *Creates a multi-purpose educational and athletic space with a new stadium, upgraded fields, and makes the site more accessible.

The City of Norwood Young America would like to invite you to check out the NYA-TV cable access channel on MediaCom channel #8 and MetroNet (formerly Jaguar Communications) channel #901. All downloading and scheduling of NYA-TV is completed at NYA City Hall. Franchise fees that are paid by local MediaCom and MetroNet customers financially support the equipment needed for this service.

In between "shows" is a scrolling bulletin board with City and community events and announcements. Paid Programming that is scheduled can include wellness videos, music concerts, crafts/hobby shows and more—these programs are either free downloads or purchased at a nominal one-time fee (usually about \$1). City/Commission Meetings can include City Council, Planning Commission, Economic Development Commission and Parks & Recreation Commission meetings. At this time, all high school events including sporting events are pre-recorded. Thank you to all of the local churches and Central Public School for participating with this great community service. Ticket & Towing

This winter the City will be stepping up its ticketing and towing of vehicles that are in violation of parking on city streets during a snow event which is the accumulation of two (2) or more inches of falling or blowing snow. Vehicles parked on a city street during a snow event will be ticketed, and if not moved within four (4) hours, and/or towed. All fines for tickets are to be paid wot the Carver County Court Administrator's Office. Vehicles that are towed will be towed to Smith Oil and Food Mart in Norwood Young America. Prior to getting their vehicle ack, the vehicle owner will be required to pay all Itowing fees, show proof of vehicle ownership, proof of vehicle insurance, and a valid driver's license. The vehicle will also have to have up-to-date license plates.

Designated Parking Areas

New for this snow season are designated parking areas for residents who do not have off-street parking available. Parking in the designated parking areas will be enforced from 2am-6am. The parking restrictions follow our city street parking ordinance as stated above (Ticket & Towing). The two designated parking spots within city limits are the north side of the Elm Street Municipal Parking Lot and the north side of Old City Hall/Food Shelf building. Watch for signs.



If there's a fire hydrant near your house, help keep it accessible this winter:

SUMP PUMP REMINDER

to work (about 3 feet)

around the hydrant for firefighters

Clear a path from hydrant to street

Sump pumps may not be discharged into the storm sewers between November 1st and April 1st. Doing so results in dangerous ice conditions on the City streets.

Should you need to discharge your sump pump during this time, please do so on your own property, away from City streets, alleys and sidewalks.

Parking

Subd.1 Snowfall. "Snowfall" shall mean any accumulation of two or more inches of snow on a street when snow is falling or has fallen within the previous twenty-four hours.


leave a motorized vehicle on any street within the City during or after a snowfall or a period of blowing snow until the snow has been removed from the street. Parking may be prohibited or restricted following snow removal as provided by City Code or State Law.

Section 720.04 Restricted Parking During Snowfall and Blowing Snow. No person shall park or Sidewalks

800.04 Removal of Snow Required. The owner of any lot or parcel of land within the City shall, within twenty-four (24) hours after a snow fall or otherwise accumulate upon any sidewalk designated by a resolution of the city Council as a part of the sidewalk thoroughfare program in front of or adjoining such lot or parcel of land, remove or cause the snow to the removed from the sidewalk.

800.05 Removal of Snow by City; Assessment. In case the owner of any lot or parcel of land within the City shall fail to remove any snow that has fallen or otherwise accumulated upon any sidewalk as required by Subsection 800.04, it shall be the duty of the street commissioner of the City to cause the snow to be removed from the sidewalk at the expense of the owner and the expense incurred in the removal thereof may be recovered against the owner in a civil action, or be assessed upon the lot or parcel of land from in front of which the snow shall be removed, and returned, collected and enforced as City taxes.
