# 9.0 Bolton and Menk Scoping Study

- Scoping study shows streets in three different areas
  - o Reconstruction
  - Mill and Overlay
  - Regular Maintenance
- Update and prioritize

Motion: MM/CS to have Bolton and Menk produce a Street Maintenance Program for all Streets and grade them based on the areas listed. Motion passed 5-0.

### 9.1 John Edison, City Attorney's Office

- Realign the way the Public Service Department is supervised by eliminating the Public Service Director position
- Position was not functioning the way it was envisioned
- Additional duties would be given to Administrator Aukrust and the Lead positions
- Leads would not have supervisory duties
- Effective date would be Friday, April 29<sup>th</sup>
- This is not a performance issue but a realignment

Motion: CH/CS to approve the elimination of the Public Service Director's position effective at the end of the business day April 29, 2022 and terminate the employment of the incumbent Public Service Director, Tony Voigt effective at the end of the business day April 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022 due to the elimination of his position. Motion passed 5-0.

## 9.2 David Flavin, Nesbit Agencies—LMCIT recommendation

- Blanket building and personal property limit went up 6.8% due to inflation
- Renewal premium went down 5.3%
- Current limit for deductible is \$5,000
- \$2,500 deductible will increase renewal \$7,904
- City averages 7.6 claims annually
- Maximum deductible is \$15,000 with a \$1,000/claim for maintenance
- Review the deductible every year with last change done in 2005

Motion: CS/CH to approve a \$2,500 deductible for the City's 2022 League of MN Cities Insurance Plan. Motion passed 5-0.

## 9.3 Old Town Architect RFQ-Administrator Aukrust

- Proposals will be due May 10, 2022
- Appointment by Council on May 23, 2022
- Architect will attend the June Parks and Recreation Commission Meeting to discuss the design process

Motion: CS/AK to direct Administrator Aukrust to publish the Old Town RFQ to solicit proposals to begin the design phase of the Old Town Project. Motion passed 5-0.

### 9.4 Eklo Development Fees - Ang

- \$4,000 per unit for SAC/WAC
- Fees were based off the 2003 project and amortized
- Past Developer had an agreement to pay fees at the time of development and homes were not built
- Does not include street or SAC/WAC going through the development
- Only covers the previous project

Motion: MM/CH to approve Mr. Eklo's offer of \$4000 per unit for Water and Sewer Availability charges for the Meadows Plat. Motion passed 5-0.

# 9.5 Resolution 2022-09 A Resolution Approving the 2022-2023 Emergency Evacuation Plan for Faxon Court

- Received plan from Owners
- Must be done yearly by Statute
- Approved by Fire Chief and City Deputy

Motion: CS/AK to approve Resolution 2022-09 A Resolution Approving the 2022-2023 Emergency Evacuation Plan for Faxon Court. Motion passed 5-0.

# 9.6 Resolution 2022-11 A Resolution Approving A Combined Preliminary and Final Planned Unit Development (PUD) Overlay for 18 3rd Avenue SE

- Convert Western building into a residential unit
- Other buildings would stay Commercial
- Build a 480 square foot garage with an apron installed and the alley repaired
- Property Owner would be responsible to improve the alley
- Current business is a service business with very few people entering

Motion: CH/MM to approve Resolution 2022-11 A Resolution Approving a Combined Preliminary and Final Planned Unit Development Overlay for 18 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue SE. Motion passed 5-0.

## 9.7 Draft Ordinance 346 Ground Mounted Solar System discussion

- · Planning Commission has discussed amendment to the code to allow ground mounted solar systems in the business industrial and light industrial zones
- Local Power Company is going to limit the size as they won't give more power than 125% than what they used the previous year
- Maximum of 10-20% of the lot
- Current ordinance does not allow any in public view
- Some businesses cannot mount on buildings due to the structure of the building
- Concern for the aesthetics

Motion: No motion at this time but would like more information about what other Cities are doing and what are there guidelines. Bring back to Planning next.

# 9.8 Resolution 2022-13 A Resolution Approving the Master Partnership Contract with the Minnesota Department of Transportation

- Current contract expires May 31, 2022
- New contract is for FY 2023-27
- In order to receive payments from the State we must have a signed contract

Motion: CS/AK to approve Resolution 2022-13 a Resolution Approving the Master Partnership contract between the City and the State of Minnesota. Motion passed 5-0.

### 9.9 City Code Change

- Drafting an ordinance to change the code regarding the speed around the school
- Deputy Voigt discussed changing Chapter 7
- Currently written that the speed is 15 mph when children are present
- Change to 20 mph year round

Motion: CS/AK to move forward with a code change for the speed limit. Motion passed 5-0.

### **Call Meeting of City Council to Order**

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Lagergren at 5:00 pm with five members present.

# **Approve Agenda**

Motion: CH/MM to approve the agenda. Motion passed 5-0

### 1. Bolton & Menk Street CIP discussion

Jake Saulsbury discussed a Street CIP.

- 2002 Full Street and Infrastructure Plan was completed
- 2002 had a combination of mill and overlay and full reconstruction
- In 2019 there was discussion of what should be done but it was decided to forego the evaluation
- There have been three projects completed since the scoping study
- There are two types of sealant: traditional chip seal and fog seal
- Fog seal is two coats and may see more debris
- Many of the streets have original watermain
- Saulsbury does not think it would take a lot to update the scoping study and the cost would be approximately \$1,000
- Council would like to see a comparison of total reconstruct vs. mill and overlay, excluding utilities
- There are five projects on the scoping study
- Should prioritize the five projects and supplement with mill and overlay
- Seal coating should be done every 5-7 years
- Add Bolton and Menk to the agenda to authorize a scoping study including seal coating

### 2. School Speed Zone discussion

Cpl. Jordan Voigt, Deputy with Carver County Sheriff's Department discussed the speed zone by Central Schools

- Current signs state speed limit at 15 mph when there are children present
- Wording leaves it open for discussion
- If we go with 20 mph speed limit year-round there is no negotiating with drivers
- This would go to the 5-way stop sign
- Will need to know who pays for them and what the additional cost is

### 3. Eklo Development Fee discussion

- Mr. Eklo has offered to pay \$4,000 per unit upfront for Development Fees
- These fees are called WAC/SAC fees in our fee schedule
- Fees are based off the project done in 2003
- The previous Developer had an agreement with the City to pay fees as they built homes
- Fees were based on the amortization schedule used for other property owners involved with the project in 2003
- Eklo's offer calculates a rate of 3.8%

# 4. Newsletter discussion

- Starting in May the newsletter will be on our website, emailed to businesses, senior facilities, and copies at City Hall
- The shortage of toner is making it difficult to continue
- Some feel the newsletter is our most valuable marketing tool and hope this is short-term

On May 3, 2022, the City received a Transient Merchant application from Gina Ehrisman from New Market, MN. The legal name of her business is Feed Your Soul, LLC d/b/a Cookie Dough Bliss Twin Cities. Her intent is to attend Norwood Young America Softball on Tuesday, May 10<sup>th</sup>, 2022 for the Raider Softball Food Truck Fundraiser and Central Schools Mental Health Day on Friday, May 13<sup>th</sup>, 2022. ## Chapter 3 of the City Code states the following:

The term "transient merchant" shall mean a person who temporarily sets up business out of a vehicle, trailer, boxcar, tent, other portable shelter, or empty store front for the purpose of exposing or displaying for sale, selling, or attempting to sell, and delivering, goods, wares, products, merchandise, or other personal property, and who does not remain or intend to remain in any one location for more than one hundred twenty (120) consecutive days.

Subject: Fee Schedule for 2022

Attached is the Fee Schedule along with suggested changes. The Pool rates were reviewed with a comparison of Lester Prairie, Silver Lake, and Belle Plaine:

• Our Family rate was considerably less than the other Cities. The rate ranged from \$145 - \$220 for a family of 5.

- Additional family members were \$20-\$30
- Event rentals are eliminated from the Fee Schedule, as the city does not have staff available to cover special events
- Swimming lessons were between \$35 and \$50

Jordan, Belle Plaine, Cologne, and Waconia were our comparison Cities with the remaining fee schedule:

- Peddler License the rate was \$100-\$200, with Belle Plaine the only one at \$100
- Solicitors License Cologne was the only one that did not charge. The others charge \$100-\$200
- ROW We would like to simplify this by having the same fee for both. The other Cities charged \$100-\$150
- Planning (CUP, Variances) These fees were \$300, with some Cities charging based on staff time
- General Permits All of our administrative permits were lower, with \$80 being the average fee
- Water main/Sewer main Trunk Charge Townhome Most cities did not charge a lesser amount for a townhome, and they ranged from \$3,250-\$5,090. Belle Plaine charged \$4,040 for WAC and \$5,090 for SAC
- Adult-Uses License Fee Cologne was \$3,570, but both Jordan and Belle Plaine charged \$10,000, annually

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 7. TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES Section 700—General Provisions

WHEREAS, the City of Norwood Young America has adopted Administration Ordinances structuring Committee and Commissions; and

WHEREAS, City Administration and the City Council have found specific sections of the existing Code that necessitate restructuring to fit the City's current needs and best interests.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORWOOD YOUNG AMERICA, ORDAINS that City Code Section 700.03 Speed. B. shall be amended to the following:

**700.03 Speed.** Any person driving a vehicle on any highway within the City shall drive the vehicle at a speed not greater than is reasonable and proper, having due regard to the traffic, the surface, and width of the highway, and of any other conditions then existing. Operating a vehicle at speeds exceeding those specified in this Section shall be prima facie evidence that the operator of the vehicle is driving the vehicle at a speed greater than shall be reasonable and proper:

- A. Not more than 30 miles per hour on any street or highway in the City except where a higher speed is posted.
- B. 20 miles per hour on Morse Street N between Hwy 212 and 7<sup>th</sup> Street SW, and 20 miles per hour on 7<sup>th</sup> Street SW between CSAH 33 and Morse Street N. (Amended by Ord. 351, May 23, 2022)
- C. Not more than 25 miles per hour on Lake Street between the intersection with Oak Street (CSAH 33) and the intersection with Reform Street. (Amended by Ord. 120, 9-14-1998)
- D. Not more than 25 miles per hour on Reform Street between the intersection with Lake Street and the intersection with Elm Street (CSAH 31). (Amended by Ord. 120, 9-14-1998)







Waste Water Treatment Plant—Boiler Line Repair

The existing boiler lines between the Lab and the Digester building at the WWTP are leaking. The city had the lines professionally pressure tested over a year ago and could not find the leak. Last winter, staff identified the leak when a spot developed in the grass in which all the snow melted. The city had a contractor come and dig up the specified area to fix the leak, only to find a dual wall pipe in the ground. Since it was a double wall pipe, the contractor could not determine how far from the dig area the inner boiler line was leaking. Due to the complexity of the underground utilities at the WWTP, an open trench dig was ruled out to minimize potential damage.

City staff explored options regarding pipe bursting or line boring to repair the boiler line. It was determined that the pipe bursting option would be the best way to minimize damage to the existing utilities. The pipe bursting process consists of driving or pulling a new pipe inside an existing line, bursting (expanding) it to allow room for installation.

Given that the leak was minimal and the WWTP operating budget was overspent in 2021 due to unplanned pump repairs earlier in the year, it was advised to perform this project in 2022. Staff solicited contractors and received the quotes below.

Diversified Plumbing & Heating Inc. \$6,950 G. F. Jedlicki, Inc. \$21,500
