Do you have a need for medication disposal? Carver County has a medicine take back

program called "Take It To The Box." The Take It To The Box program promotes the safe use, safe storage and safe disposal of unneeded prescription and over-the-counter medications. This includes both human and animal medications along with illegal drugs.

- ⇒ Chanhassen City Hall (7700 Market Blvd) M-F 8am-4:30pm
- ⇒ Waconia City Hall (201 Vine St S) 7days a week/24 hrs a day
- ⇒ Chaska Sheriff's Office (606 E 4th St) 7days a week/24 hrs a day

What do you do?

Leave medication in the original container. Remove your name or other identifying info. Leave the name of the medication. Drop medication into the disposal box opening at any of the three locations.

Yes, they accept:

Prescription medicines, controlled substances, over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, supplements, pet medicines

No, they do NOT accept:

Needles, sharps or syringes, medicines from: healthcare facilities, clinics, pharmacies, pharmaceutical reps, veterinary clinics, vaping devices or e-cigarettes.



The NYA Parks & Recreation Commission has developed a plan to replace the playground equipment at NYA Legion Park. The current equipment has become cracked and faded, however, definitely served its purpose of safe entertainment and physical play for all those children and visitors of the park!

The NYA Parks & Recreation Commissioners have been preparing for this project for over a year by researching multiple vendors and designs. The attached renderings show the details and location—which will replace the current equipment in it's entirety—and will be purchased from and installed by Landscape Structures.

This year, the 2022 NYA Parks & Recreation Commission budget includes \$35,000 to put towards its goal to replace the playground equipment at NYA Legion Park. The City of Norwood Young America is accepting donations to fulfill this goal. When our community comes together for the common good, great things happen here in Norwood Young America!

24 Hour Snow Removal Required for City Sidewalks

Shovel Your Sidewalks

City Code allows for the assessment of fees associated with snow removal if you do not clear your sidewalk within 24 hours of a snow event:

800.04 Removal of Snow Required. The owner of any lot or parcel of land within the City shall, within twenty-four (24) hours after a snow fall or otherwise accumulate upon any sidewalk designated by a resolution of the city Council as a part of the sidewalk thoroughfare program in front of or adjoining such lot or parcel of land, remove or cause the snow to the removed from the sidewalk.



800.05 Removal of Snow by City; Assessment. In case the owner of any lot or parcel of land within the City shall fail to remove any snow that has fallen or otherwise accumulated upon any sidewalk as required by Subsection 800.04, it shall be the duty of the street commissioner of the City to cause the snow to be removed from the sidewalk at the expense of the owner and the expense incurred in the removal thereof may be recovered against the owner in a civil action, or be assessed upon the lot or parcel of land from in front of which the snow shall be removed, and returned, collected and enforced as City taxes.
