In addition, you will continue to see staff and contractors focusing on the ongoing maintenance of our streets — patching potholes, crack filling and seal-coating. Completing the work on updating our streets is a priority for this Council and expect to see even more work in the future!

Look for groundbreaking around town — both residential and commercial. This spring, Greenwood Marina will be the final business in our completed Tacoma West Industrial Park. We look forward to breaking out the gold shovels as we celebrate their entrance into our business community! In addition, we hope to see new homes constructed in the Meadows. With the heightened awareness of our community as the western edge of the four lane expansion on Highway 212, we look forward to even more development in the future!

Look for the recently approved expansion at Central Schools. We are so excited to see the great enhancements coming to our local school district. We are especially proud of the partnership with Central Schools that allowed an indoor four lane walking track as part of the gymnasion expansion project. We love working together to provide even more opportunities to our residents. Also, a special shout out to Mr. Hallquist and his Middle School Computer Application students. History of the Merger

In 1974, the first referendum vote to merge the cities of Norwood and Young America passed in Norwood but not in Young America. However, the idea of one community did not go away. Starting in 1995, committees were established to begin the merger process. The committees studied several areas; Fire Department, Public Works, Wastewater Treatment Plant, Post Office, City Buildings, Policing, etc. As committees collected results, public meetings were held to inform the residents and get input.

In September of 1995, both City Councils decided that a combined majority of votes between both cities would determine if the Merger would pass, rather than counting votes separately in both cities as in the past. The question passed





Do You Know How to Recycle a Household Battery?

Hopefully, you took the extra time last weekend, when you reset your clocks to also check your smoke detectors. If so, you may have some used batteries to dispose of. Batteries are essential for today's "unplugged" lifestyle, but they also contain toxic metals, such as lead, cadmium and lithium that are released into the environment when disposed or recycled the wrong way.

All types of non-alkaline batteries, especially lithium, or Li-ion, also hold a small amount of charge, called a "residual" charge, after they are no longer strong enough to run a camera, toy or other product. The residual charge or energy may be released as heat or fire if batteries are damaged or punctured. Batteries should always be stored so that the terminals (or + and - ends) are not touching each other or any type of metal. Store them in their original packaging which is designed to keep terminals separated or tape all battery ends or terminals (except alkaline which are not a fire hazard).

The first thing to know is that batteries placed in your curbside recycling bins won't be recycled. They can't be picked out by the equipment designed to crush and sort large volumes of paper, glass and plastic. They are small and may be damaged by equipment designed to break down larger recyclables. Batteries that are damaged by a compactor truck or recycling facility equipment may start all of the recyclables on fire! Fires caused by lithium and other batteries have resulted in the damage or complete destruction of several recycling facilities in Minnesota.

All batteries with the word "Alkaline or Alcaline", "General Use" or "Carbon Zinc" on the label can be placed in the garbage, since the recyclable content is

low and they are not a fire hazard. Very few HHW and retail sites collect these batteries for recycling, contact them ahead of time to find out. All other batteries can be recycled at the Carver County Environmental Center at 116 Peavey Circle in Chaska.

The NYA Parks & Recreation Commission has developed a plan to replace the playground equipment at NYA Legion Park. The current equipment has become cracked and faded, however, definitely served its purpose of safe entertainment and physical play for all those children and visitors of the park!

The NYA Parks & Recreation Commissioners have been preparing for this project for over a year by researching multiple vendors and designs. The attached renderings show the details and location—which will replace the current equipment in its entirety—and will be purchased from and installed by Landscape Structures.

This year, the 2022 NYA Parks & Recreation Commission budget includes \$35,000 to put towards its goal to replace the playground equipment at NYA Legion Park. When our community comes together for the common good, great things happen here in Norwood Young America!

Recreational Fires

Recreational fires are required to be at least 25 feet from all buildings, structures or combustible materials such as wood, paper or plastics. A fire should be no larger than three feet in diameter by two feet in height, using dry, clean wood; for recreational, ceremonial, food preparation or social purposes. Recreational fires must be constantly attended until the fire burns out completely or is extinguished by either an on-site fire extinguisher, dirt, sand or garden hose. These must be readily available at all times until the fire is extinguished.

Sump Pump Regulations

All sump pumps must be day-lighted into your yard or into the storm sewer—not into your neighbors yard or a public sidewalk. Sump pumps should also not be connected into the sanitary sewer! Doing so results in the treatment of unnecessary amounts of water, putting additional strain on the treatment system and raising prices for everyone.

Golf Cart/ATV Permit

Chapter 7 of the NYA City Code allows for a person to drive a Golf Cart or Class 2 ATV on City streets as long as a permit is obtained and the operator has a valid driver's license. There is an annual permit fee of \$10.00 for these recreational vehicles. Applications can be filled out right at City Hall or found on the City website at www.cityofnya.com.
