Kroells called the meeting to order at 9am.

5.1 Senior Residence Updates

a. Harbor / Haven

Simmons shared there are 9 open apts in the Harbor, 4 in the Haven and Reflections is full. Hilgers shared that the Ecumen HR/consultants reviewed the facilities and gave great feedback on how well cared for the residents are, good food and services, and a great facility. Hilgers shared they are still hiring for RA's and dining assistants. Activities are picking up including planting flowers with the Lions. They are holding off on a Fall Ball, however, hoping for a Spring Fling.

b. Peace Villa

Simmons shared the construction project will start the first part of July. Price increased from \$639,000 to \$1M.

Kroells shared there were 25 people at the last NYA Senior Center day. The next Senior Center will be Wed, September 21st as there is a Bloodmobile the first Wednesday of September.

5.3.1 Lunch & Learn

Hallquist shared there is no update at this time.

5.4 Carver County Public Health

Plummer encouraged seniors to talk to their primary physician about when their fourth booster should be taken. Boosters are available at the Chaska Gov't Center to the public on Tuesdays from 2-6pm. CCPH nurses are available to reserve a spot at 952-361-1559. They also have an option to do boosters at resident's homes. Plummer shared there is a Senior Expo (non-covid related) in Victoria soon.

5.5 Carver County Sheriff's Department

Voigt shared that there will be more patrols in the area the next two weeks concentrating on seatbelt safety. Voigt reminded the commissioners about watching for motorcycles and no texting while driving. Kroells questioned the seatbelt clips – she will look at her AARP information. Commissioners mentioned the concern with left turns at Hwy 212 and Faxon. 55 Alive class will be coming to town soon.

6.1 Food Distribution - Friday, June 3, 2022

Hallquist shared information about the Food Distribution, there are eight (8) new community garden plots added, the raingardens at City Hall are being killed off and replanted in 2023, and kids/students/parents will have an opportunity to get lunch meals at the pavilion every Monday from Jun 13th -August 15th courtesy of CCPH, Gather & Grow Food Shelf in Waconia, and City of NYA. Hallquist also mentioned updates on the Meadows/Budahn property and the masonic building.
