As a City Council, we have been blessed with an amazing team of individuals and groups who work with us to make Norwood Young America an amazing place to live and work!

Partnerships with our many civic groups: Our civic groups (NYA Lions, West Carver Lions, Willkommen Heritage Society, American Legion, VFW, Beyond the Yellow Ribbon, NYA Area Chamber of Commerce, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts) have often partnered with the City to enhance playgrounds and parks. Our most recent partnership with the Willkommen Heritage Preservation Society resulted in the return of the band shell to Legion Park. In addition, our civic groups are responsible for planning community events that bring individuals together for a common goal - sometimes the goal is to have fun, sometimes the goal is to honor individuals, and sometimes the goal is to raise money for an important cause.

Partnerships with the county: The City is grateful for the opportunity to partner with Carver County Public Health, CAP Agency, Second Harvest, and Gather and Grow Food Shelf of Waconia to bring food distributions to NYA and Western Carver County this year. The monthly food distributions are serving over 300 households per month along with over 70 families per week at the most recent summer Pick-n-Packs at the Willkommen Memorial Park Pavilion.

Partnerships with our schools: St. John's Lutheran School partners with the Stiftungsfest Committee to use their parking lots for handicapped parking and to host several events. The new updates to Central Public Schools will include an indoor walking track for community members to use at no cost. Plus... District #108 Community Education planned a fabulous summer of Music in the Park for the community to enjoy!

Partnerships with housing developers: As new homes are planned and constructed in the community, our trail and sidewalk system is enhanced. The Prairie Dawn Park and playground is our most recent addition when the last big development occurred.

Partnerships with our staff: Our City staff do an amazing job every day making sure the City runs smoothly. This month Brian Schneewind will be retiring from the Public Service Department after a long career with the city. We will miss his positive attitude and wish him well on his next endeavor!

What started out as a one-day celebration has grown to be a four-day celebration as NYA's Fire Department's annual fundraiser—100% of the proceeds benefit the fire department. Monies earned have gone to help pay for trucks, training, and needed equipment in recent years.

One hundred sixty one years ago a German singing society in Young America began a music festival that has grown and evolved over the years to become an annual celebration that honors NYA's strong German heritage. No Need for Speed-ing

At the May 23, 2022 City Council meeting, Deputy Voigt recommended the approval of Ordinance 351 amending section **700.03 Speed B.** of the City Code. The previous speed limit along 7th Street SW (from CSAH 33/Kwik Trip to the 5-way stop) and North Morse Street (from Hwy212/Dairy Queen to the 5-way stop) read "15 mph While Children Are Present." The approved amendment updated the code and changed the speed limit to **20 mph AT ALL TIMES**.

Carver County Commissioner Update

Commissioner John P. Fahey was present at the July 25, 2022, City Council meeting with an update on Carver County projects.

- Hwy 212 (Dahlgren Township segment) is tracked for October 2022 completion!
- Hwy 212 from Norwood Young America to Cologne starts construction in 2024!
- Carver Co Board approved \$5.9 million bid from MetroNet (Federal stimulus funds) to install CarverLink fiber infrastructure.
 "Connect Up Carver" has an anticipated completion date of Dec 2024. Carver County will be the first MN county with 100% fiber access for nearly every residence and business.
- Carver County is the fastest growing (and healthiest) county in MN (based on percentage growth) with the average home value at \$452,300 with property median residential values increase of 21.1%.

A Piece of History Restored

The Willkommen Heritage & Preservation Society of Norwood Young America dedicated the refurbished 1900 band shell at NYA Legion Park on June 9, 2022.

The new plaque reads the history of the band shell: "Erected in 1900 and located next to the Norwood Pavilion, this band shell hosted various



bands for weekend concerts and special occasions. Sold and moved to a private

residence in the late 1920's and had been utilized as a garage and a gazebo. In 2020 the current owner Danielle Beisell graciously donated the band shell to the City of Norwood Young America. Through the guidance of the Willkommen Heritage Center, the band shell has been restored to its original condition and returned to Legion Park."

Friendly Reminders

Watering Ban

The City of NYA is under a watering ban from 10am to 5pm daily. Odd/even watering is allowed from 5pm to 10am. What does that mean? If your address is 123 Main Street, you can water on odd numbered calendar days (August 21,23,25...) If your address is 124 Main Street, you can water on even numbered calendar days (August 22, 24, 26...). Thank you for your help with keeping our water supply safe!



NYA Compost Site-640 Tacoma Blvd

The NYA Compost Site is available to citizens who reside within the city limits of NYA. There is NO charge for disposal of yard, garden and tree waste. Watch for specific areas for dropping off your yard waste. And please do not dump any garbage at this site!

NYA Recycling Drop-off Site-421 W Railroad Street, NYA

The NYA Recycling Drop-off Site is open to all residents and businesses year round for general recyclables—fibers, plastics, metal, and glass. Hours from April—November are Wednesdays 3-6pm and Saturdays 8am-noon.

General Recyclables

- Fibers brown grocery bags, beer & soda cases, cake & snack boxes, cardboard (non-waxed), catalogs, cereal boxes, magazines, office/school paper (all colors), junk mail, newspaper & inserts, telephone books and other soft cover books, pizza delivery boxes, broth boxes, drink boxes, juice cartons, milk cartons (*please break down and flatten cardboard boxes before placing into roll-off containers*)
- Plastic containers berry containers, juice containers, milk jugs, plastic food and beverage containers #1 & #2, plastics #3-#7 with a screw top, water bottles, yogurt tubs, butter tubs
- Metal & Glass aluminum cans, empty aerosol cans (non-toxic & no caps), metal household items (cooking pots & pans), steel food cans, tin & other household metals, beer bottles, glass containers that held food or beverage products, all colored glass bottles or jars (brown, green and clear)

Special Wastes

- Used motor oil, oil filters & antifreeze (pour carefully, take all empty containers home & throw in household trash, including boxes from oil filters.
- Automotive batteries
- Scrap metal *(metal only, no appliances)*
