NYA Watering Ban

There is a city-wide watering ban from 10am-5pm daily. Watering is permitted on an odd/even address schedule from 5pm-10am. Sprinkling ban violations may result in monetary offenses.

Become an Election Judge

Election judges are temporary, paid employees of local election officials trained to handle all aspects of voting at the polling place. Serving as an election judge is a chance to learn about elections, and is a great service to the community.

- You must be eligible to vote in Minnesota and able to read, write and speak English.
- Candidates cannot serve in a precinct where they are on the ballot.
- You must attend a required training that will be roughly two hours in length (in-person or virtual).
- Work days are the primary and general elections. A smaller workforce is usually needed for the primary. In some cases, you can ask to only work the general election in November
- 16 and 17-year-old students can work as election judge trainees, receive training, and be paid for their work. It's a great way to learn about elections and voting, and earn cash at the same time!

City Project Updates The Meadows 2nd Addition

Owner Mark Eklo of STP Investments LLC, has been working with the city to bring housing development to the Meadows (former Budahn) property. Eklo has proposed a development of 35 single family custom built homes and 39 single slab villas to this 22 acre parcel. Pending Met Council approval, Eklo is hoping to start grading and building a model villa yet this fall.

Willkommen Memorial Park Old Town Project

The NYA Parks & Recreation Commission and community representatives from the Young America Cardinal Baseball Team and Stiftungsfest have been meeting with architects Vic Perlbachs and Allen Perlbachs of The Design Partnership LTD to create design plans for the "new" Old Town. Due diligence has been done at the Council and Commission levels with the decision on reconstruction versus renovation. The city is looking to invest in reconstructing the building along with significant improvements needed to fix drainage issues, comply with ground-level handicap accessibility, create an open-concept concession stand, add efficient storage, and increase the size of the crow's nest—

all while using the same foundation to recreate the entire outside design shell. Upon City Council approval, the goal is to take the existing Old Town down after Stiftungsfest 2022, bid the project in fall, construct in spring/summer 2023, and complete the new Old Town by Stiftungsfest 2023.








Welcome New Businesses



Friendly Reminders

Golf Cart/ATV Permit

Chapter 7 of the NYA City Code allows for a person to drive a Golf Cart or Class 2 ATV on City streets as long as a City permit is obtained and the operator has a valid driver's license. There is an annual permit fee of \$10.00 for these recreational vehicles. Applications can be filled out right at City Hall or found on the City website at www.cityofnya.com.



Toilet Paper Only Please!!

Flushable wipes are NOT flushable! These wipes do not break down or disintegrate. They can actually cause sewer backup into resident's homes along with clogging pumps with city sewer equipment—which is costly to taxpayers. Please do not flush wipes—throw them away.

Lawn Maintenance

Yard grass must be maintained at no longer than 6" high. Please ensure your grass clippings do not blow onto the street. The clippings cause the storm sewer to clog, which may cause flooding in your home or your neighbor's home.

Sump Pump Regulations

All sump pumps must be day-lighted into your yard or into the storm sewer—NOT into your neighbor's yard or a public sidewalk. Sump pumps should also not be connected into the sanitary sewer. Doing so results in the treatment of unnecessary amounts of water, putting additional strain on the treatment system and raising prices for everyone.

Love them. Leash them. License them.

According to Spots.com (a subsidiary of Amazon.com), 54% of Minnesotans own a dog. That statistic holds true in Norwood Young America. To support local pet owners, the city has set up dog waste stations along our trails and is hoping to establish a Dog Park within the next year. Dogs continue to be a welcome site on the trails and in the parks throughout our community. However, city code bans dogs

from athletic fields and playgrounds (defined as the space covered by wood chips in our parks). This allows our ballfields and playgrounds a cleaner space for people to enjoy. Few more pet-owner reminders:

- ⇒ You must have your pet licensed annually with the city—\$5/year per pet. Bring in a copy of up to date vaccine papers.
- ⇒ Always have your pet on a leash or restraint when walking.
- ⇒ Please be a responsible dog owner and clean up after them!
