NYA City Happenings



NYA Manufacturing Today

The City of Norwood Young America and Norwood Young America Economic Development Commission, along with the Central Trades & Advisory Group, held the 2nd Annual NYA Manufacturing Today on Wednesday, October 19th. The event featured 20–25-minute tours at six (6) local manufacturers plus a presentation by Central Public School Superintendent Tim Schochenmaier who spoke about student/manufacturer partnership programs. This year's event was a huge success with about 70 students and a dozen community members in attendance. The intention of this event is to recognize the NYA manufacturers for National Manufacturing Week/Month of October and expose future workforce to well-paying jobs opportunities and careers in the NYA area.

The Central Trades & Advisory Group includes representatives from Central Public Schools, City of NYA, NYA Area Chamber of Commerce, and local NYA manufacturers. The efforts of this group are to encourage students to discover the opportunities and successes of the trades and manufacturing businesses in the area. In his presentation at the NYA Manufacturing Today event, Mr. Schochenmaier shared information on Central Public School's "On the Job Training" and "My First Job" programs. Both programs are amazing opportunities for all parties involved – gaining school credits, earning a wage, exposing students to the latest – greatest manufacturing technology and equipment, growing relationships with a potential employer, and bringing much needed workforce to our local manufacturers. Also emphasized with these programs is the fact that students do not need a four-year degree for these positions, rather attendance at a trade school or 2-year school that could be paid for by their employer.

The six (6) locations of the manufacturing tours were as follows: Sackett-Waconia, Yeager Machine, ASI (Acoustical Surfaces, Inc.), Modern Design Cabinetry, Storms Welding, and Bongards Creameries. Students took a survey about manufacturing in NYA, and the following were recurring themes in the feedback:

- High starting wages (at least \$20/hour)
- Job opportunities available (the labor shortage)
- Surprised by the job opportunities specifically in NYA
- Ability to get a job without a college degree and before you turn 18 (summer jobs and internships)
- 56 of 69 students would consider a job or career in manufacturing in the future.



Election Day Registration

To register at your polling place on Election Day, bring one proof of residence listed below:

- 1. ID with current name and address
- 2. Photo ID plus a document with your current name and address
- 3. Registered voter who can confirm your address
- College student ID with housing list

- 6. Note of late registration
- 7. Staff person of a residential facility

Approved photo ID's (Choose one—can be expired):

- Driver's license, State ID or learner's permit issued by any state
- US Passport
- US Military or Veteran ID
- Tribal ID with name, signature and photo
- MN university, college or technical college ID
- MN high school ID

Rural Minnesota Freight Highway to Get \$10 Million Face-Lift

A 90-year-old undivided two-lane freight corridor is getting a \$10 million face-lift in a Minnesota agricultural belt where truckers, commuters and farmers cope with high crash rates and congestion.

Carver County is receiving a U.S. Department of
Transportation grant to improve freight mobility and safety
along U.S. Route 212 that will reconfigure intersections
in areas with high crash rates and enable truckers to carry goods
more efficiently.

A vital route between rural southwest Minnesota and the Twin Cities, U.S. 212 spans 161 miles in Minnesota and has been designated a critical rural freight corridor by the state department of transportation. It provides a major freight connection for 22,000 square miles of rural Minnesota and South Dakota.

Gayle Degler, commissioner of Carver County, told Transport Topics the grant will help the county (35 miles southwest of Minneapolis) complete the last five-mile section of U.S. 212 within about two years.

Funding will go toward right-of-way acquisitions, soil corrections and preserving some historic landmarks. The roadway was part of the transcontinental Yellowstone Trail established in the heyday of the Model T.

The \$10 million grant will help complete the U.S. 212 project that will total nearly \$77 million, said Sara Renney, communications manager at Carver County Public Works.

According to a 2019 freight mobility and safety project report by Carver County, freight bottlenecks along U.S. 212 negatively impacted 65 freight generators and resulted in a 17% increase in operational costs. At the same time, 72% of county residents who commute are stuck in traffic congestion.

Carver County officials determined that the average trip length is 61 miles for personal users and 91 miles for freight traffic.

Not only supporting interstate freight traffic, U.S. 212 is important for intrastate truck shipments with Carver County and seven other counties each accounting for 5% of freight traffic on the corridor.

The federal Infrastructure for Rebuilding America grant awarded Sept. 15 will remediate current safety issues arising from narrow lanes and shoulders, limited turn lanes, conflicts with rural farm equipment, problem intersections and traffic issues involving drivers having to merge from a four-lane divided highway into a two-lane undivided one.

The DOT noted that in the past five years, three fatalities occurred at one intersection along U.S. 212 in the county, and the project area has a higher-than-average crash rate.

"Many crashes were freight-related or roadway departure crashes that could be avoided by the roadway expansion, addition of rumble strips and reduced conflict intersections," DOT stated, adding that a traffic study revealed that "a great majority of the corridor congestion is caused by crashes, which impacts efficiency of freight movement" for major local freight generators.

New safety features will include reduced conflict intersections and a grade-separated interchange. A bridge will be built near the location of Bongards Dairy, a farmer-owned co-op established in 1908 in Chanhassen that is known for its cheeses.

"Bongards is a large dairy. They have lots of trucks going in and out," Degler said, explaining how the bridge is needed to avoid creating a dangerous intersection for the dairy and local farmers driving with combines and wagons.

"You don't want to cross a four-lane highway with a combine," he said. "So we're making a bridge to make it a lot safer for agricultural vehicles and agricultural equipment," he added, saying the project is "going to make it safer for everybody."

Friendly Reminders

NYA Recycling Center - 421 Railroad St W

The NYA Recycling Center is owned by Carver County Environmental Services and operated by the City of NYA. The NYA location is open Wednesdays from 3pm—6pm (April-Nov), 3pm—5pm (Dec-Mar), and Saturdays from 8am—12pm. Fibers (cardboard/paper products), plastic containers, metal and glass are acceptable recyclables. Please help keep the NYA Recycling Center clean so that NYA residents can continue to enjoy this service at no cost.

Weather Rules for Operation of Golf Carts/ATVs

City Code 750.08 Conditions of Operations: Operation of golf cars or Class 2 ATV on permitted streets within the City shall operate from sunrise to sunset between April 1 to November 1, except during periods of inclement weather or when visibility is impaired by weather, smoke, fog, or other conditions, or at any time when there is insufficient light to clearly see persons or vehicles on the roadway at a distance of 500 feet.

Parking During a Snowfall

Subd.1 Snowfall. "Snowfall" shall mean any accumulation of two or more inches of snow on a street when snow is falling or has fallen within the previous twenty-four hours.

Section 720.04 Restricted Parking During Snowfall and Blowing Snow. No person shall park or leave a motorized vehicle on any street within the City during or after a snowfall or a period of blowing snow until the snow has been removed from the street. Parking may be prohibited or restricted following snow removal as provided by City Code or State Law.

Designated Parking Areas

Effective November 1 to April 1, no parking is permitted on main streets in the downtown and business areas of town from 2:00am-7:00am. Please watch for signs.

The City offers designated parking areas for those residents who do not have off-street parking during a snow emergency—VEHICLES ONLY! NO TRAILERS! Parking in the designated parking areas will be enforced from 2am-6am. The two designated parking spots within city limits are the north side of the Elm Street Municipal Parking Lot and the north side of Old City Hall/Food Shelf building. Watch for signs. All violators will be towed at owners expense.
