



A Message From the City Council

As a City Council, we are currently focused on setting a preliminary budget for 2023. The process requires us to review the decisions of the past year and set the priorities for next year. John Maxwell, a well-known author wrote: "Change is inevitable. Growth is optional." By being purposeful in our planning, we can make the best decisions for our community.

Planning for ongoing street maintenance:

As a community we can celebrate the completion of the Second Avenue Reconstruction Project. At a total cost of over \$5 million dollars, this much needed improvement, which included a Lift Station upgrade, was an important and much needed project for us. A smaller street project will be included in the 2023 budget with the exact location yet to be determined.

A frequently asked question is why the Council is not following the model of Central Public Schools and bonding for all the roads at one time. The simple answer - we cannot take on that much additional debt and maintain our current credit rating. As the debt load decreases we will have more financial flexibility for future projects.

Planning for a second Industrial Park:

We are so blessed to have Sackett Waconia, Yeager Machines, Vickerman Co. and now Greenwood Marina in our community within the Tacoma West Industrial Park! With the completion of our first industrial park, plans for a new park will be included in the 2023 budget. Thank you to the Carver County CDA for a \$100,000 grant as seed money for the purchase of land for a second park in our community.

Planning for updates to Old Town:

Old Town was constructed in 1991 and has been an important part of Willkommen Memorial Park since that time. Did you know that Old Town was designed to commemorate the original buildings of Main Street? For the past several years, the Council has been setting aside funds to update Old Town. The current building will be taken down with a new building, honoring the current style, completed by the end of next summer.

For the past two years, the Council purposefully set a low levy to honor the financial burdens of households and businesses caused by the pandemic. Due to the rising costs of everything, the levy for 2023 will be higher than the past two years. As a Council, we are purposefully planning for the future. **Norwood Young America is more than a place, it is our home** and we will continue to plan for the best home possible!

"Old Town In The Park" Established 1991

...Once upon a time in the year 1990 a deep desire grew in the community to help beautify Willkommen Memorial Park. Six organizations formed a park board approved by the City Council. They began work on a project for the park.

"Old Town in the Park" is the theme name given to the first phase of the park project. We hope you enjoy the complex as much as we have enjoyed putting it together.

The first section on the left is the dugout for the Young America Cardinals baseball team. The top of the dugout consists of a press box and on top of the press box is where the old original city bell is housed. The bell-tower is fashioned after the tower on the old city hall built in 1909.

The next building is the concession stand. It is designed to resemble the old "Mankenberg Hotel." Karl Mankenberg owned this hotel in about 1879. The hotel was later occupied by the Post Office until 1980. It still stands at its original location on Main Street.

The third building is the Young America VFW Auxiliary's Popcorn Stand. It is designed to resemble the old Young America Bank originally built in the year 1900. This original building also remains on Main Street.

The fourth building is a combination concession/storage area. It was fashioned after part of the old livery barn (a place where horses are kept). A portion of the livery barn remains in town. It is presently part of the feedmill.

The fifth section is an open shelter which is utilized by our local Fire Department during Stiftungsfest. It is an ideal place to host picnics the rest of the time.

The roof line is designed to tie in with the pavilion roof line. Some European flair was added to give it a uniqueness all its own. We hope you enjoy the new area!

The "new" Old Town is slated for the same look and feel as the current buildings, and will serve the same purpose, however, have much needed ADA code upgrades and improvements that will serve the community more safely and efficiently.

The National Fire Protection Association is celebrating the 100th anniversary of Fire Prevention Week. This year's campaign, "Fire won't wait. Plan your escape" works to educate everyone about simple but important actions people can take to keep themselves and those around them safe from home fires. In a fire, mere seconds can mean the difference between a safe escape and a tragedy. Fire safety education isn't just for school children. Teenagers, adults, and the elderly are also at risk in fires, making it important for every member of the community to take some time every October during Fire Prevention Week to make sure they understand how to stay safe in case of a fire. Since 1922, the NFPA has sponsored the public observance of Fire Prevention Week. In 1925, President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed Fire Prevention Week a national observance, making it the longest-running public health observance in the country. It is observed each year during the week of October 9th in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire, which began on October 8, 1871, and


