February is when we recognize those individuals who improve our lives. One of my favorite quotes is by Phil Jackson: *The strength of the team is each individual member. The strength of each member is the team.* The City of Norwood Young America has a fantastic group of thoughtful, dedicated individuals we call our staff. This newsletter is a chance to celebrate their contributions.

<u>Administration</u>: City Administrator Andrea Aukrust is ultimately responsible for everything that happens throughout the city. She maintains the vision of the community — *shaping a strong and diverse economy and quality neighborhoods through planned, economical, and sustainable growth.* She is the liaison between the City Council and City Staff. Her job is all-encompassing. City Clerk Angela Brumbaugh is the official keeper of city

records and supports the City Administrator and City Council. She is responsible for posting all city meetings, maintaining council minutes, and signing all official documents. In addition, she serves as the city's head election official.

<u>Finance Department</u>: The City's Finance Director, Angela Brumbaugh (yes, she has a dual role), is responsible for maintaining the city's budgets, both revenues and expenses. Accounting Clerk Alicia Menzel is responsible for utility billing and accounts payable. She also serves as the face of city staff to the community, welcoming visitors to City Hall.

<u>Community and Economic Development</u>: The Community and Economic Development Director, Karen Hallquist, is the first point of contact for new business inquiries — residential, commercial, and industrial. She is also the individual who supports businesses that are looking to expand and grow. In addition, she working with the Parks and Recreation Commission to recommend changes and/or enhancements to the City Council. Another big part of her job is marketing — she is responsible for community engagement through the city newsletter, website and social media accounts, and representing the city with county, state, and federal representatives. Cristi Kinkel, her assistant, supports all the work done in the community and economic development department, as well as being another welcoming presence at the front desk of City Hall.

<u>Public Services</u>: The Public Works staff, Randy Clay, Mark Streich, Joel Decker, Sam Starke, and Nathan Roy, are responsible for maintaining our city streets, parks, and trails. This includes plowing, patching, mowing, monitoring, and trimming trees along the

boulevards. They are also responsible for all city buildings, the City Pool, and the City Compost/Recycling sites. In addition, Public Works is responsible for maintaining the city's fleet of vehicles. Public Utilities staff Paul Dhoore and Rod Jaus maintain the city's wastewater and water treatment plants. They ensure that our water is safe to drink and that our wastewater is safe to release into the environment. They are also responsible for maintaining city infrastructure and hydrants — you may see city trucks around town flushing hydrants and jetting lines.

Our staff is amazing — not only are they responsible for the jobs listed above, but they also spend time cross-training to support their colleagues when things get challenging. These individuals truly are fabulous examples of a **TEAM** where **Together**, **Everyone Achieves More**. Without them, our community wouldn't be the fabulous, welcoming place where people say —

Carver County Announces Changes to the 2023 Spring Special Waste Collection

CHASKA, MINN. February 15, 2023 — Carver County Environmental Services announced that it will be changing the location of the 2023 Spring Special Waste Collection.

For nearly 30 years Carver County has successfully held a Spring Special Waste Collection event in the City of Norwood Young America at Central High School. Due to a major construction project at the High School, this year's collection event will be relocated to the Carver County Public Works Facility in Cologne, MN. Carver County hopes to return to Norwood Young America for a Special Waste Collection in the spring of 2024. Saturday, May 20th, from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm, the 2023 spring collection will be open to Carver County residents at the Carver County Public Works Facility, 11360 US HWY 212, Cologne MN.

This event is a good opportunity for residents to dispose of unwanted items that should not be thrown in the trash. The event is open to all Carver County residents and accepts residential waste only, no business waste will be accepted.

Items accepted: tires, appliances, electronics items, scrap metal and household hazardous wastes (paints, cleaners, pesticides, fluorescent lamps, automotive fluids, etc.). A fee will be charged for disposal of some items (appliances, tires, televisions, computer monitors, gasoline powered equipment and bicycles). Items not accepted: household garbage, furniture, mattresses, paper/carboard/plastic recycling, and oil or household hazardous waste in containers larger than 5 gallons in size.



Carver County News: How to Remove Stubborn Ice

Learn tips to remove ice while protecting waters—Carver County Water Management Organization Feb 15, 2022



- 1. Do not rely on ONLY salt to remove ice. Grab an ice chipper. These two together can make quick work of ice.
- 2. Wait for a warmer temperature day, high 20s to low 30s.
- 3. Sprinkle de-icing salt widely. Walk away for awhile and let it do its work. In warmer temperatures, it will work faster. Regular sodium chloride salt will not work below 15F.
- 4. When the salt has disappeared and dissolved into the ice, grab an ice chipper and chip and scrape the ice away.
- Using just a bit of salt can loosen the ice for you to chip away and protects lakes and rivers from chloride pollution.

Do you have a need for medication disposal?

Carver County has a medicine take back program called "**Take It To The Box**." The **Take It To The Box** program promotes the safe use, safe storage and safe disposal of unneeded prescription and over-the-counter medications. This includes both human and animal medications along with illegal drugs.

- ⇒ Chanhassen City Hall (7700 Market Blvd) M-F 8am-4:30pm
- ⇒ Waconia City Hall (201 Vine St S) 7days a week/24 hrs a day
- ⇒ Chaska Sheriff's Office (606 E 4th St) 7days a week/24 hrs a day

What do you do?

Leave medication in the original container. Remove your name or other identifying info. Leave the name of the medication. Drop medication into the disposal box opening at any of the three locations.

Yes, they do accept: Prescription medicines, controlled substances, over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, supplements, pet medicines

No, they do NOT accept: Needles, sharps or syringes, medicines from: healthcare facilities, clinics, pharmacies, pharmaceutical reps, veterinary clinics, vaping devices or e-cigarettes.

Recycling Drop-Off Site Information

On the corner of Railroad Street and Reform Street, the city has a recycling drop-off site open to all residents of Carver County. The following materials are accepted at this site:

- Automobile batteries
- Motor oil
- Plastic Bags
- Cardboard
- Paper, plastic and cans and glass
- Scrap metal

Please follow these guidelines when visiting the site: break down and flatten cardboard boxes; bring someone with you to lift heavy containers and materials, keep recycling loose and not in plastic bags or boxes, store motor oil in containers of 5 gallons or less and take the containers back home with you.

The recycling drop-off site is open on Wednesdays from 3PM to 5PM and on Saturdays from 8AM to noon. The site will follow the calendar of Carver County Environmental Services and will be closed on holiday weekends.

NYA Compost Site

(located within the Tacoma West Industrial Park)

The NYA Compost Site is available to citizens who reside within the city limits of Norwood Young America.

The site is open dawn to dusk. There is no charge for disposal of yard, garden and tree waste. Watch for specific areas for dropping off your yard waste. Please do not dump any garbage at this site!

Recycling items will not be accepted. Recycling items can be dropped off at Carver County's Recycling Site located at 421 Railroad St W.

This FREE event is for NYA CITY RESIDENTS ONLY who reside within the city limits only — businesses are not included. This drop-off event is for non-hazardous household waste/junk. Participants will be asked to show proof of residency such as a driver's license and/or water bill. This drop-off event is for all residential dwellings including apartments and manufactured homes.

ACCEPTABLE HOUSEHOLD WASTE/JUNK-ITEMS FOR DROP-OFF

- Furniture items (couches, chairs, tables, lamps, mattresses, box springs, etc.)
- Small amounts of remodeling materials (carpet, siding, drywall, blocks, bricks, etc.)
- Misc. items such as kids' toys, playground sets, doors, windows, toilets, etc.
- Participants are asked to bag and box the loose materials as much as possible

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- ♦ Regular household weekly garbage or recyclable items
- Vehicle tires, appliances, any electronics, batteries, fire extinguishers, propane tanks, prescription drugs
- No hazardous waste such as paints, liquids, chemicals, asbestos materials, herbicides, pesticides, household cleaning products, lawn chemicals, lighter fluid, mothballs, lye, pool chemicals, nail polish remover, solvents, spot removers, stains and finishers, etc.
- ♦ No motor oil/filters, oil rags, petroleum products/containers, anti-freeze, brake fluid
- Fluorescent tubes/lights, incandescent light bulbs
- ♦ Cement, asphalt, large quantities of demo material
- ♦ No yard waste (grass clippings, shrubs, plants, tree limbs, leaves, garden waste)
