1. Call meeting to Order

- Durbin called the meeting to order at 9:00 am.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

- All present recited the Pledge of Allegiance

3. Adopt Agenda

Motion: TS/AK to approve the agenda with adding Metro Mobility as an update with the Council Update. Motion passed. 8-0

4. Approve minutes from January 19, 2023

Motion: KH/BS to approve the minutes with the correction of PV update was by Williams and not Durbin. Motion passed 8-0.

5. Updates

5.1 Senior Residence Updates

a. Harbor/Haven

- Hilgers shared that the Harbor has 2 open apartments/1 reserved, Haven 9 open/3 reserved, Reflections has 1 open. There are 9 open positions including Life Enrichment Assistant, Business Services/HR, dining, cook, and RA's. There is no need for agency assistance at this time.

b. Peace Villa

- Simmons shared that PV is 100% occupied and construction is about 90% completed. Project came in overbudget at about \$1 million.

c. Oak Grove

- Hampshire shared AnneMarie Stolz is filling in full day on Fridays. There is one deluxe apartment available.

5.2 City Bus Update

5.2.1 Shopping Trips

- Hallquist reported that out of town shopping trips will now be \$5/person. She will talk with City Clerk about the in-town shopping and senior center trips to verify all should be paying \$2/person. Spille asked about annual passes.

5.2.2 "Out & About" Trips

- Hampshire and Settergren requested Arlington Thrift Stores and Bakery on March 23rd. Those attending should contact Hallquist. Minimum of 6 needed for the trip.

5.3 NYA Senior Center

- Durbin reported attendance of 18 – the weather was a factor.

5.4 Carver County Public Health

- Plummer reported there is no more federal funding for booster kits as of May. Carver Co Community Health Assessment Results are out for 2019. Plummer will be asking NYA SAC to participate this year. CCPH is researching efforts on helping to control binge drinking in CC as this is a problem. Simmons asked about mental health facilities and probability of them coming back to help with mental health issues. CCPH is researching a program that Scott County is doing called "Move Mindfully" which is supported with Covid relief funds. The program focuses on mental health through movement. Plummer also reported that Senior Linkage does not get contacted much from CC residents.

 - Simmons reported about 130 people participated in the Fare For All event at All Saints Church.
 - Latzig reported the walking track/accessory gym will start to be constructed in fall 2023. Hallquist commented there is no grant available to help with the funding for the walking track.
