



## **Message From The Council**

Commissioner John Fahey shared some highlights from the Carver County Board at a recent City Council meeting. As he reviewed the fantastic things happening in the county, it was an opportunity to review what we continue to accomplish as a city on the western edge of Carver County's borders.

**Population Growth:** As a county, the population has increased by 17.4% in the past ten years. During that same time, Norwood Young America experienced above-average growth and expanded by approximately 8%! As shared at the recent Small Business Seminar, Norwood Young America has had an 84% success rate for new business retention in the past five years, which is again above average, and is certainly something to celebrate!

Highway 212 Expansion and Updates: This summer, work will continue on 3.5 miles of Highway 212 as it passes through Cologne. This work will be focused on repairing concrete pavement, resurfacing and widening road shoulders, and bridge improvements ... AND ... thanks to the hard work of our Commissioners and Carver County staff, an additional \$10 million USDOT grant was awarded to the second phase of the Highway 212 Expansion. This newest grant will support the other overpass at Highway 51 (Bongard's crossing) costs. The final expansion is scheduled to begin in 2024 and finish in 2026.

Focus on Going Green: 27,000 county residents visited the Carver County Environmental Center last year. In our community, citizens continue to take advantage of the Railroad Street recycling center on West Railroad Street ... see posted hours and days of service on the fence. In addition, city residents continue to drop off leaves and branches at our local compost site on Tacoma Avenue and pick up black dirt and wood chips. This service is free to all citizens within the city limits. Finally, the local City-Wide Clean Up on April 29th was a HUGE success. This was an opportunity for our city residents to drop off, free of charge, large items that would typically require a drop-off or pick-up fee. Thank you to Waste Management and our Public Works Staff, Joel, and Rod, who helped the event run smoothly!

Food Distributions: Carver County Public Health provided needed food to more than 50,000 people at 39 food distributions throughout 2022 ... one of those events was in Norwood Young America. The monthly food distribution in the City Hall Parking Lot will continue through December 2023. (See details inside the newsletter.) Approximately 380 families are provided food from Second Harvest each month to supplement their families' food budget. In addition, the weekly Summer Meals for Kids program (every Thursday, now called the NYA Free Produce Market) restarted at the Willkommen Memorial Park Pavilion on May 18 from 3:30 to 5:00 PM. So many great things are happening at the County and City level, and sharing them with you each month is a pleasure. At the recent Small Business Seminar, Mayor Lagergren shared the following story: About two weeks ago, while attending ribbon cuttings of new businesses in town, I heard a similar message from both owners. At Bevens Creek Inn, the owner discussed a partnership with Alli B's Coffee Shop to provide a coffee coupon to those staying at the hotel. At Tin Roof Powder Coating, the owner talked about another business in the city that had been thinking about expanding its marketing and was hoping to work with Tin Roof on a big order. You've all heard "teamwork makes the dream work," but you may not have heard about the acronym **TEAM - "Together** everyone achieves more."

**Did You know...** A vast ribbon of history runs through Norwood Young America. Many of you drive it every day, east to Waconia or west to Glencoe. You are driving part of the 3,719-mile-long Yellowstone Trail. The first coast to coast highway built for the northern tier of states in 1912. A small section of The Yellowstone Trail remains in NYA from the corner of Morse Street and Railroad Street West (also known as old 212) to behind Lano Equipment.

The Yellowstone Trail auto route ran from Plymouth, Massachusetts to Seattle, Washington. It was hoped you would stop along the trail and visit Yellowstone National Park in Montana. Sadly, by 1930 the Yellowstone Trail Association had disbanded due to the Great Depression.

**Today...** The Yellowstone Trail Association has been revived to urge travelers to get off the interstates and drive the scenic routes of America. You can travel "A Good Road from Plymouth Rock to Puget Sound." The Willkommen Heritage Center is where to begin your adventure on the Yellowstone Trail in Minnesota. Stop by to pick up your Yellowstone Trail Guide Folder and follow the trail to collect wooden tokens along the way. The cost is only \$5 dollars. ## Highway 212 in Cologne

MnDOT will repair approximately 3.5 miles of Hwy 212 as it passes through the city of Cologne and portions of Benton and Dahlgren townships.

### Location

Hwy 212 between just west of the western Co. Rd. 36/Hwy 212 intersection in Benton Township and about a half-mile east of the eastern Co. Rd 36/Hwy 212 intersection in Dahlgren Township.

## **Summary of Work**

- Repair concrete pavement and resurface roadway shoulders
- Repair two bridges over the railroad
- Install cable median barrier and update guardrail
- Widen U-turn shoulders at the Reduces Conflict Intersections

## Traffic Impacts

Motorists can expect lane closures with head-to-head traffic on one side of Hwy 212 during the entire project. A temporary signal will be placed at Hwy 212 and the western Co. Rd 36/Hwy 212 intersection. Hwy 212 access and crossing at Hwy 284 and county roads 53, 41, and 36 (east junction) will be closed or limited with detours.

## Want healthier soil, cleaner water, and happier wildlife? Carver County News-May 2023

Add native plants to your yard. What plants are considered native?

Native plants are those that are local to Minnesota, those that were growing here when European immigrants first arrived. They are adapted to our climate and soils, are drought tolerant, and disease resistant. Most native plants do not require fertilizer or even water once established, and they tolerate our extreme Minnesota weather. As a result, they typically thrive with less care than non-native species. Common native plants in Minnesota include Red Osier Dogwood, Purple Coneflower, Sensitive Fern, Compass Plant, Black Eyed Susan, and Butterfly Milkweed. It is important to increase native plant populations to protect lakes and rivers, soil health, and wildlife.

## How do native plants help water and wildlife?

Native plants help reduce water pollution. They have deep roots that allow rainwater to soak well into the ground. Rain that does not soak into the ground flows off lawns and pavement and into storm drains where it is carried away to nearby ponds, lakes, and streams. This rain runoff brings with it many pollutants such as bacteria, sediment and phosphorus. Native plants soak up that rainwater and filter pollutants leaving less runoff and less water pollution to cause problems. Have a soggy spot in the yard? Create a small native plant garden there. The plants will soak up and use the extra water. Native plants improve soil health. The roots help decrease soil compaction, stabilize the soil, and reduce erosion. Plants in the legume family, such as purple prairie clover or wild indigo, take nitrogen from the air and put it in the soil, building up your soil's nutrients. Native plants are relatively maintenance free. Their long roots allow them to find their own water, even during droughts and they do not need mowing, fertilizers, or pesticides. Native plants provide nectar, berries, seeds, and shelter that birds, pollinators and other wildlife rely on. Lots of grassor non-native plants in a landscape can create a "food desert" for Minnesota wildlife species that have evolved with and need native plants. For example, the common blue butterfly and many birds rely on the Red Osier Dogwood. The Monarch and many other butterflies need milkweeds including Butterfly Milkweed which is one of the few native bright orange flowers. Many pollinators rely on asters, such as New England Aster, for late season food. Asters typically bloom August through October and can add a pop of color to your yard as other plants settle down for winter.

#### Funds are available to help

Several programs provide funding to residents to put native plants in their lawn. Carver County hosts two programs that provide funds to install native plants, one focuses more on pollinator habitat and one on water quality improving projects. ## **Friendly Reminders**

#### **Golf Cart/ATV Permit**

Chapter 7 of the NYA City Code allows for a person to drive a Golf Cart or Class 2 ATV on City streets as long as a City permit is obtained and the operator has a valid driver's license. There is an annual permit fee

of \$10.00 for these recreational vehicles. Applications can be filled out right at City Hall or found on the City website at www.cityofnya.com.

#### **Lawn Maintenance**

Yard grass must be maintained at no longer than 6" high. Please ensure your grass clippings do not blow onto the street. The clippings cause the storm sewer to clog, which may cause flooding in your home or your neighbor's home.

#### Stagnant Water and Mosquitos

Please do your part to keep mosquitoes under control. Stagnant water is a haven for mosquitoes and violates the City Code. Any property found to violate the City Code will result in daily aggregated administrative fines that will be invoiced to the property owner until the violation is remedied. Should the invoice not be paid, it will be assessed on the property owner's taxes. City Code 600.02 Public Nuisances Affecting Health. Subd. 1 The following are hereby declared to be nuisances affecting health: C. All ponds or pools of stagnant water.

#### **Sump Pump Regulations**

All sump pumps must be day-lighted into your yard or into the storm sewer—not into your neighbors yard or a public sidewalk. Sump pumps should also not be connected into a sanitary sewer drain! Doing so results in the treatment of unnecessary amounts of water, putting additional strain on the treatment system and raising prices for everyone.
