As a City Council, we depend on the recommendations of our Advisory Commissions, groups of dedicated individuals with a positive mental attitude and a common purpose. These Commissions, made up of volunteers from the community, address the varied needs and issues of our citizens.

The **Planning & Zoning Commission** is required by Minnesota State Statutes and is a seven-member commission which conducts public hearings regarding all planning related activities, including but not limited to, amendments to the zoning ordinance, plat approval, variances, and conditional use permits. After conducting a public hearing, it is this Commission's responsibility to make formal recommendations regarding these issues to the City Council. Most recently the Planning Commission reviewed building and landscaping standards for the new Industrial Park expansion as well as options for solar panels in the Industrial Park. The **Economic Development Commission** is a nine-member commission composed of two City Council members, one Planning Commission member, five members from the local community representing local businesses and industries, and an NYA Area Chamber of Commerce representative. The Commission advises the City Council on matters concerning commercial and industrial development within the city as well as recommending marketing plans, programs and strategies to attract new businesses and retain existing ones. Recently, they have focused on a new Facade Improvement Loan Program (info coming out soon) as well as a Housing Study to attract new developers to our city. The **Parks and Recreation Commission** is a seven-member body composed of one City Council member, one Planning Commission member, one representative from School District 108 and four members from the local community. This Commission reviews issues related to the development of parks and trails in the City. Recently, they have made recommendations to the City Council on the new playground at Legion Park, the decommission of the Skate Park as well as the new plan for Old Town. They are currently working on details for a new Memorial Tree Program which will be introduced to the Council in August. Thank you to our

The **Senior Advisory Commission** acts as a liaison for the senior community and advises the City Council on issues concerning senior citizens, and also recommends appropriate solutions. Recently, this Commission has focused their energies on the NYA Senior Center, the Lunch and Learn Program, and sharing information via the city newsletter and NYA-TV about food and safety resources. Save the Dates—Stiftungsfest 2023

Since 1861, Stiftungsfest has been Minnesota's Oldest Celebration. What started out as a one-day celebration has grown to be a four-day celebration as NYA's Fire Department's annual fundraiser—100% of the proceeds benefit the fire department. Monies earned have gone to help pay for training, equipment, and this last year...a new command vehicle.

One hundred sixty two years ago a German singing society in Young America began a music festival that has grown and evolved over the years to become an annual celebration that honors NYA's strong German heritage. Stiftungsfest, which means "Founders Day" in German, is host to one of Minnesota's best softball tournaments, over a dozen amazing bands, a local firefighter challenge, Stiftungsfest Ambassador Coronation, bean bag/kickball/3-on-3 basketball tourneys, FunRun, Car Show, Cribbage/Sheephead/Chess Tourney, paintball, and so much more. Area churches organize Thursday Night Family Night with FREE events for kids including Ninja Everywhere, Kids Pedal Pull sponsored by the VFW, and the movie Encanto sponsored by 2BContinued. New this year is a Puzzle &

Guzzle Contest Friday night (see website for details) and a Kid's Sunday Funday with FREE bouncy house rides and facepainting sponsored by the America Legion. And don't forget the food! Did You Know....

It's Town Ball summer and you can catch the action of not one, but two Town Ball teams in Norwood Young America! Watch the Norwood Indians (NYA Sports Complex Zellmann Field) and the Young America Cardinals (Willkommen Memorial Park Ballfield) play in one of Minnesota's finest amateur baseball leagues, The Crow River Valley League (CRVL).

Both the Norwood and Young America team's began to play baseball in the late 1890's. Organized teams began in Young America in 1904 and 1906 in Norwood. Teams would invite other teams to town to play in tournaments for prize money. Teams were allowed to hire other ballplayers, usually pitchers, to stack their team.

State Tournament play began in 1924. Norwood became a member of the CRVL in 1931. There was a player shortage due to WWII and the CRVL did not resume play until 1946. Young America became a member of the CRVL in 1946 and Norwood rejoined in 1949. The Indians and the Cardinals have won numerous CRVL titles, Regional titles and both have reached the State Tournament.

Amateur baseball played in Minnesota exists nowhere else. "Town Ball" as it is known here provides a great summer pastime for players and fans. So, get out to the ballpark soon, enjoy a beverage and burger and cheer on the boys of summer!



For more information on the NYA Town Ball teams and other local NYA history, visit the Willkommen Heritage Center Thurs-Sat 10am-2pm. Also, make sure to stop at the Center during Stiftungsfest to view displays that feature the history of local gas stations and garages and Stiftungsfest. The Center is located on the corner of Main Street and 1st Ave SE across from Willkommen Memorial Park.

An Emergency...Who Do You Call...and When?

Sometimes it's hard to know who to call when there is an emergency...or maybe it isn't an emergency? The City of Norwood Young America contracts with the Carver County Sheriff Department for emergency and non-emergency services. Regardless of the situation, there is help for you to reach out to when you need it.

The definition of an emergency is "An urgent, sudden, and serious event or an unforeseen change in circumstances that necessitates <u>immediate action</u> to remedy harm or avert imminent danger to life, health, or property." Here are some examples of who to call and when to call for both emergency and non-emergency situations:

Call 911:

- ⇒ Medical need
- ⇒ Auto accident
- ⇒ Fire/smoke
- ⇒ Active shooter
- ⇒ Crime (in action)
- ⇒ Kidnapping
- ⇒ Harm to a life
- ⇒ An active suspicious situation
- ⇒ Gas leak/down power line

Call the Carver Co Non-Emergency Line (952)361-1231:

- \Rightarrow Noisy party
- ⇒ Barking or stray dog
- \Rightarrow Neighbor dispute
- \Rightarrow Solicitor with no permit
- ⇒ Graffiti or vandalism
- \Rightarrow Fraud
- ⇒ Theft (with no suspect present)
- \Rightarrow A suspicious situation (with no imminent threat)

Watering Ban

The City of NYA is under a watering ban from 10am to 5pm daily. Odd/even watering is allowed from 5pm to 10am. What does that mean? If your address is 123 Main Street, you can water on odd numbered calendar days (August 21,23,25...) If your address is 124 Main Street, you can water on even numbered calendar days (August 22, 24, 26...). Thank you for your help with keeping our water supply safe!



NYA Compost Site—640 Tacoma Blvd

The NYA Compost Site is available to citizens who reside within the city limits of NYA. There is NO charge for disposal of yard, garden and tree waste. Watch for specific areas for dropping off your yard waste. Please do not dump any garbage at this site!



Meals on Wheels from the CAP Agency: Any adult over the age of 60 is eligible for senior nutrition regardless of income. A donation of \$5 per meal is suggest, but not required. No senior is denied a meal service.

- Reservations must be made 7 business days in advance
- Fill out the registration form with staff by phone
