### 1. Call to Order

Hormann called the meeting to order at 5:15 p.m.

A. Pledge of Allegiance - all those present stood for the Pledge of Allegiance

### 2. Adoption of Agenda

### 5. New Business

A. Presentation of Interactive Park Maps on City Website
Hallquist showed commissioners how to access the interactive park maps on the website.
From the main page:

- Click on Community at the top
- Click on Parks and Trails
- On the new page, scroll down, under Trials/Sidewalks/Connectivity, and click on the red link NYA Park Activity and Trails Finder (click here!)
- Brings up the GIS map of the parks in NYA
- A Welcome message is displayed
- On the right-hand side, a legend pops up where you can select a Park Activity
- If you click on "Baseball", the icon will pop up on the parks that have that activity available
- You can zoom in and see an aerial picture of the park and activity
- There is also an interactive map for the Bench Donation Program

### 6. Old Business/Updates

### A. Old Town Update

Hallquist shared that at the next Council meeting, Old Town will be talked about again and voted on whether to pursue the project or not. YA Cardinals and Stiftungsfest representatives will be there to commit to helping ask for donations and pledge money to the project.

### B. All Park Assessment Update

Hallquist shared that City Staff is currently measuring the use zone of the playground around the equipment. Lion's Park playground has the biggest need for fresh mulch and border. Public services staff have been mitigating weeds in the parks. Next month we will be talking about the playgrounds at South Park, Kehrer Park, and Casper Park. Prairie Dawn and South Park basketball courts will be striped and the tennis courts at Friendship Park for Gus and Julie Wischnak to paint the pickleball courts. Would like to do a work session to go over the park assessment report in detail.

### C. Arbor Day Event

Hallquist shared that the event was successful! Around 30 participants with a wide range of ages, seven blaze maples were planted, coloring activities, and playing in the park. Everyone who wanted one went home with a free sapling. Need to start planning for next year's event, trees need to be ordered in January to guarantee to receive them.

### D. Adopt-A-Park Program and Application

Hallquist shared that most groups were interested in continuing with their current adoption, there are a few parks that still need to be adopted. The Lord family had some ideas for South Park, such as adding some benches. The application lays out the adoption group's responsibilities and the responsibilities of the city. Will be updating the application and getting a new signed agreement from groups.

### E. Tree Program

Hallquist shared the draft brochure, outlining the details of the program (cost of the tree, engravable plaque option, certificate). Last discussed Friendship Park and Prairie Dawn Park as first-choice planting sites and the potential of offering Legion Park and Veterans Park specifically in memory of a veteran.

Commissioners discussed offering the choice of the plaque to the donor, whether they would get to choose, or if the commission would decide which option would be offered. Commissioners agree the tree hugger plaque seems like the best option because it does attach to the tree with a spring, is covered in a plastic coating to grow with, and helps protect the trunk of the tree. The planting sites seem like appropriate places to plant, check with the VFW about planting trees at Veterans Park.

Hallquist will reach out to the VFW and update the plaque option to the tree hugger, and commissioners will vote on the final recommendation to present to the City Council at the next Parks meeting.

### 7. Commission Updates

Hormann - The grandstand at Wilkommen Park is dusty, would be nice to get it sprayed out before the first game.

Hallquist – Planning Commission is working on driveway standards and city code and ordinances addressing landscaping and façade for industrial park standards. EDC is doing an updated housing study to address how much housing is needed in NYA and the types of housing developments that need to be added. SAC hosted a Lunch & Learn on Senior Rights, with about 40 people in attendance. Senior Center will be reopening in September.

RE: National Fitness Campaign

Blue Cross Blue Shield of MN has partnered with the National Fitness Campaign to bring ten (10) Fitness Courts to MN each year starting in 2024. These are open-air courts with circuit equipment. Staff viewed a demo for the program as attached in the packet.

### Highlights include:

- Fitness courts are made of the same materials as playground equipment, so it is weather resistant.
- The Fitness courts are ageless anyone can use them.
- NFC offers an app that offers guidance to those who want to use it as an exercise regimen.
- NFC makes a large production of the planning, installation, and marketing of each project to bring attention to the community and beyond.
- The Fitness Courts are a new "niche" which draws people to the community.
- BCBS and NFC offer grants up to \$75,000 (includes structure and artwork)
- City fund commitments can be a range of \$135,000-177,000
- Potential for outside sponsorship opportunities SHIP, local clinics, etc.

Staff is recommending keeping this idea on the "back burner" for a future project.

After many years of research and discussions, the NYA City Council approved the bid for \$813,244.00 to RAM General Contracting, Inc. for the Old Town project at the Monday, June 26, 2023, Council meeting.

Representatives from Stiftungsfest & Young America Cardinals will be meeting again to make a proposed game plan for donation requests/ recognitions to present to both of their respective groups. Attached is the information brochure the groups will be using to ask for donations.

The plan for donation recognition (since it will be on the "New" Old Town wall) was approved by City Council at the July 24, 2023, meeting.

The contract with RAM General Contracting starts on August 30, 2023, with a completion date no later than June 30, 2024. Best case scenario of demo and framing yet this fall, interior work over winter, and completion in spring 2024. RAM will notify the city when the demo occurs for those who want to watch.



# **The History of Old Town**

Old Town was constructed in 1990-1991 by a group of community members who wanted to beautify Willkommen Memorial Park by building a structure to resemble historic buildings from the now former Young America, MN. At the time, the YA Cardinals donated \$5,000, the Fire Department donated \$10,000, and a private donation of \$20,000 got the project started. More donation of came in as construction happened. At the time of construction, no formal structural engineering services were used; however, the building committee used their trades, talents, and love for the project to complete it. Old Town has brought fame to Willkommen Memorial Park and the community of Norwood Young America.



### Old Town Today

Approximately ten years ago, the NYA Parks & Recreation Commission and City Council started conversations concerning the structural integrity of the building. After countless meetings with contractors, engineers, and building officials, it was determined that Old Town is too compromised in its current conditions of drainage issues, rain damage, and walls decomposing. Old Town was determined to need a complete reconstruction.

The City of NYA and representatives from the Young America Cardinals and Stiftungsfest have worked with a local architect and structural engineer for the "New" Old Town. This new building project will keep the integrity of the present historical design while updating needed health and safety concerns. The intentions are to continue to honor the dedication of the original community member's Old Town project.



### Facts of Old Town:

- Serves as the "home field" for the Young America Cardinals from April – July annually for home baseball games and fundraising events.
- Consumed by Stiftungsfest one week in August annually for multiple concession stands and
- baseball games along with using the iconic image of the structure for marketing purposes.
   Everyone knows Old Town!
  - Everyone knows Old Town!Used by local service organizations (NYA Lions,
    - West Carver Lions, Boy Scouts, Chamber of Commerce) for drive through and park events throughout the year.
- Used for Central JV/middle school baseball games March – May annually.



# Facts of "New" Old Town Project

- The New Old Town Project is a complete reconstruction with the hopes of expanding on the existing footings.
- The City of NYA has budgeted monies of \$510,000 over the course of the years toward the project. Approximately \$65,000 of the total has been spent on professional architectural and structural engineering services to guide the City Council on building safety and health improvements.
  - A second construction bidding process deemed the project at an \$813,000 total completion cost. Pricing considers the current high construction rates. Local contractors will be used for the project

Memorial Tree Program Update

Staff has updated the Memorial Tree Program and brochure to the following:

- Offering four types of trees (Maple, Crabapple, Oak, or Evergreen) for a price of \$400 which includes the tree, memorial certificate, delivery and planting.
- Trees will be planted in the spring and fall. Donators will be notified of the date of the planting.
- Donators have the option of selected parks to plant the tree, with reserving NYA Legion Park and Veteran's Park for those honoring a veteran.
- Donators have an option of purchasing a "Tree Hugger Plaque" for an additional cost of \$54.95. The Tree Hugger Plaque is made of stainless steel it will not rust and can be engraved with up to 5 lines of 35 characters each. The plaque comes with a small or large spring encased in plastic to protect and grow with the tree. The city holds no liability for the plaque.

The Memorial Tree and Park Bench Program was developed by the City of Norwood Young America's Parks and Recreation Commission to provide an opportunity to recognize residents who have made an impact in the community, honor a loved one who passed away, or celebrate a milestone.



Family and friends can join together to donate a personalized park bench or memorial tree to be planted in one of the local parks. This generous donation will be a lasting memory, while enhancing the beauty of the community.

### Application Process

Once an application for a tree or park bench has been received, City staff will review it and contact the applicant within 30 days. The application will be approved after City staff and the applicant meet to review location and engraving language. City staff will try to accommodate all requests, but reserves the right to limit locations, placement and total number of trees or benches at any City location. After an application is approved, payment will be collected, and the tree or bench with personalized engraving will be ordered.

### Benches

After the application has been received, location agreed upon and the payment clearing, the City will order materials necessary to complete the project. Installation time varies depending on seasonal restrictions, equipment ordered and supplier inventory. Donors will be notified prior to scheduled installation.

The City of Norwood Young America shall be responsible for the bench installation and will provide a concrete pad for the bench. The Parks & Recreation Department along with the Public



The bench slats are constructed from recycled plastic materials and backed by a 50 year warranty. The legs are made of coated aluminum. Regular maintenance will be completed on the legs, due to weathering.

The City reserves the right to relocate the bench if unforeseen circumstances arise due to its location or setting, such as a park renovation.



### Trees

Family and friends can leave a living legacy by planting a tree variety that is tolerant of the climate, such as Maple, Crabapple, Oak, or an Evergreen. Each tree will come with a memorial certificate. Donators will have the option to purchase a 2"x6" engraved, stainless steel plaque that wraps around the tree with an encased spring that will grow with the tree. Visit with city staff for more information.



The City of Norwood Young America will provide care for the trees by watering and pruning, as necessary. Trees will be planted in the Spring or Fall and if the tree fails to thrive within the first 3 years, the City will replace the tree.

Memorial trees will be planted in select local parks, reserving plantings at NYA Legion Park and Veterans Park for trees planted in honor of a veteran.
